Definitions of "Frozen" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “frozen” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Preserved by freezing sufficiently rapidly to retain flavor and nutritional value.*
- *Absolutely still.*
- *(of a liquid) having turned into ice as a result of extreme cold.*
- *Devoid of warmth and cordiality; expressive of unfriendliness or disdain.*
- *Incapable of being changed or moved or undone.*
- *Incapable of being changed or moved or undone; e.g.*
- *Not thawed.*
- *(used of foods) preserved by freezing sufficiently rapidly to retain flavor and nutritional value.*
- *Covered or rigid with ice.*
- *Turned into ice; affected by freezing or by long and severe cold.*
- *(used hyperbolically) very cold.*
- *(of food) stored at a very low temperature in order to preserve it.*
- *(of a ball) resting against another ball or a cushion.*

- *Not convertible to cash.*



Synonyms of "Frozen" as an adjective (26 Words)

arctic	Of or relating to the Arctic. <i>An arctic climate.</i>
chilled	(of food or drink) cooled in a refrigerator. <i>By Sunday evening I m usually feeling pretty chilled.</i>
extreme	Far beyond a norm in quantity or amount or degree; to an utmost degree. <i>In extreme cases the soldier may be discharged.</i>
fixed	Having a fixed and unchanging value. <i>With eyes set in a fixed glassy stare.</i>
flash-frozen	Preserved by freezing sufficiently rapidly to retain flavor and nutritional value.

freezing	(of fog or rain) consisting of droplets which freeze rapidly on contact with a surface to form ice crystals. <i>It was freezing cold outside.</i>
frigid	Devoid of warmth and cordiality; expressive of unfriendliness or disdain. <i>A frigid day.</i>
frosted	(of lipstick, eyeshadow, or nail varnish) having a pale, pearlescent sheen. <i>There was frosted glass on the office door.</i>
frosty	Covered with frost. <i>A cold and frosty morning.</i>
frozen stiff	Devoid of warmth and cordiality; expressive of unfriendliness or disdain.
glacial	Extremely slow (like the movement of a glacier). <i>A glacial lake.</i>
ice-cold	As cold as ice.
iced	(of a surface or object) covered or coated with ice. <i>Campari and soda in a tall iced glass.</i>
icy	Very cold. <i>Icy northern waters.</i>
numb	So frightened as to be unable to move; stunned or paralyzed with terror; petrified. <i>The tragic events left us shocked and numb.</i>
numb with cold	Not showing human feeling or sensitivity; unresponsive.
numbed	So frightened as to be unable to move; stunned or paralyzed with terror; petrified.
polar	Having electrical or magnetic polarity. <i>Polar weather.</i>
preserved	Prevented from decaying or spoiling and prepared for future use. <i>Preserved manuscripts.</i>
quick-frozen	Preserved by freezing sufficiently rapidly to retain flavor and nutritional value.
raw	Used of wood and furniture. <i>Raw sugar.</i>
rooted	Exhausted; worn out. <i>The front wheel looks rooted.</i>
siberian	Of speech sounds produced by forcing air through a constricted passage (as `f', `s', `z', or `th' in both `thin' and `then).
stock-still	Absolutely still.
very cold	Precisely as stated.

wintry

Characteristic of winter, especially in feeling or looking very cold and bleak.

Wintry smile.

antarctic	The region around the south pole: Antarctica and surrounding waters.
arctic	The regions to the north of the Arctic Circle centered on the North Pole. <i>An arctic climate.</i>
cold	A low temperature cold weather a cold environment. <i>Had her lines cold before rehearsals started.</i>
coldness	(in reference to colour) the quality of containing pale blue or grey. <i>He replied with coldness in his voice.</i>
cryogenic	Relating to or involving the branch of physics that deals with the production and effects of very low temperatures. <i>A body being prepared for cryogenic preservation.</i>
floe	A sheet of floating ice.
freezing	The freezing point of water 0 C. <i>It was freezing cold outside.</i>

frigid	Extremely cold. <i>Frigid water.</i>
frostbitten	Injured by freezing or partial freezing. <i>Frostbitten grapes unsalable as fresh fruit.</i>
frosty	Covered with frost. <i>A frosty glass.</i>
gelid	Icy; extremely cold. <i>She gave a gelid reply.</i>
glacial	A glacial period. <i>An official described progress in the talks as glacial.</i>
ice	A frozen mixture of fruit juice or of flavoured water and sugar. <i>The ice in his voice was only to hide the pain.</i>
iceberg	Lettuce with crisp tightly packed light-green leaves in a firm head. <i>Iceberg is still the most popular lettuce.</i>
icecap	A mass of ice and snow that permanently covers a large area of land (e.g., the polar regions or a mountain peak).
icicle	Ice resembling a pendent spear, formed by the freezing of dripping water.
icy	Extremely cold. <i>Her voice was icy.</i>
polar	Of an animal or plant living in the north or south polar region. <i>Most polar birds breed seasonally.</i>
preserved	Maintained in its original or existing state. <i>Preserved manuscripts.</i>
refrigeration	Deliberately lowering the body's temperature for therapeutic purposes. <i>Commercial refrigeration units.</i>
rime	Ice crystals forming a white deposit (especially on objects outside). <i>He does not brush away the frost that rimes his beard.</i>
saved	Guarded from injury or destruction. <i>A saved soul.</i>
sherbet	A flavoured sweet effervescent powder eaten alone or made into a drink. <i>I went down the local pub for a few sherbets.</i>
sleet	Sleet falls. <i>If the temperature rises above freezing it will probably sleet.</i>
snow	Fall as snow. <i>We were trudging through deep snow.</i>
snowfall	Precipitation falling from clouds in the form of ice crystals. <i>The average snowfall is 75 m a year.</i>

- snowy** (of weather or a period of time) characterized by snowfall.
*A long **snowy** winter.*
- standoffish** Lacking cordiality; unfriendly.
*A **standoffish** manner.*
- winter** Spend the winter.
*The tree has a good crop of berries in **winter**.*
- wintry** Characteristic of or occurring in winter.
*Brown **wintry** grasses.*
