Definitions of "Frozen" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “frozen” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Preserved by freezing sufficiently rapidly to retain flavor and nutritional value.*
- *Absolutely still.*
- *(of a liquid) having turned into ice as a result of extreme cold.*
- *Devoid of warmth and cordiality; expressive of unfriendliness or disdain.*
- *Incapable of being changed or moved or undone.*
- *Incapable of being changed or moved or undone; e.g.*
- *Not thawed.*
- *(used of foods) preserved by freezing sufficiently rapidly to retain flavor and nutritional value.*
- *Covered or rigid with ice.*
- *Turned into ice; affected by freezing or by long and severe cold.*
- *(used hyperbolically) very cold.*
- *(of food) stored at a very low temperature in order to preserve it.*
- *(of a ball) resting against another ball or a cushion.*

- *Not convertible to cash.*

| freezing | (of fog or rain) consisting of droplets which freeze rapidly on contact with a surface to form ice crystals. <i>It was freezing cold outside.</i> |

| frosted | (of lipstick, eyeshadow, or nail varnish) having a pale, pearlescent sheen. <i>There was frosted glass on the office door.</i> |
| frosty | Covered with frost. <i>A cold and frosty morning.</i> |
| frozen stiff | Devoid of warmth and cordiality; expressive of unfriendliness or disdain. |
| glacial | Extremely slow (like the movement of a glacier). <i>A glacial lake.</i> |
| ice-cold | As cold as ice. |
| iced | (of a surface or object) covered or coated with ice. <i>Campari and soda in a tall iced glass.</i> |
| icy | Very cold. <i>Icy northern waters.</i> |
| numb | So frightened as to be unable to move; stunned or paralyzed with terror; petrified. <i>The tragic events left us shocked and numb.</i> |
| numb with cold | Not showing human feeling or sensitivity; unresponsive. |
| numbed | So frightened as to be unable to move; stunned or paralyzed with terror; petrified. |
| polar | Having electrical or magnetic polarity. <i>Polar weather.</i> |
| preserved | Prevented from decaying or spoiling and prepared for future use. <i>Preserved manuscripts.</i> |
| quick-frozen | Preserved by freezing sufficiently rapidly to retain flavor and nutritional value. |
| raw | Used of wood and furniture. <i>Raw sugar.</i> |
| rooted | Exhausted; worn out. <i>The front wheel looks rooted.</i> |
| siberian | Of speech sounds produced by forcing air through a constricted passage (as `f', `s', `z', or `th' in both `thin' and `then). |
| stock-still | Absolutely still. |
| very cold | Precisely as stated. |

Characteristic of winter, especially in feeling or looking very cold and bleak.

| antarctic | The region around the south pole: Antarctica and surrounding waters. |
| arctic | The regions to the north of the Arctic Circle centered on the North Pole. <i>An arctic climate.</i> |
| cold | A low temperature cold weather a cold environment. <i>Had her lines cold before rehearsals started.</i> |
| coldness | (in reference to colour) the quality of containing pale blue or grey. <i>He replied with coldness in his voice.</i> |
| cryogenic | Relating to or involving the branch of physics that deals with the production and effects of very low temperatures. <i>A body being prepared for cryogenic preservation.</i> |
| floe | A sheet of floating ice. |
| freezing | The freezing point of water 0 C. <i>It was freezing cold outside.</i> |

| frigid | Extremely cold. <i>Frigid</i> water. |
| frostbitten | Injured by freezing or partial freezing. <i>Frostbitten</i> grapes unsalable as fresh fruit. |
| frosty | Covered with frost. A <i>frosty</i> glass. |
| gelid | Icy; extremely cold. She gave a <i>gelid</i> reply. |
| glacial | A glacial period. An official described progress in the talks as <i>glacial</i> . |
| ice | A frozen mixture of fruit juice or of flavoured water and sugar. The <i>ice</i> in his <i>voice</i> was only to hide the pain. |
| iceberg | Lettuce with crisp tightly packed light-green leaves in a firm head. <i>Iceberg</i> is still the most popular lettuce. |
| icecap | A mass of ice and snow that permanently covers a large area of land (e.g., the polar regions or a mountain peak). |
| icicle | Ice resembling a pendent spear, formed by the freezing of dripping water. |
| icy | Extremely cold. Her voice was <i>icy</i> . |
| polar | Of an animal or plant living in the north or south polar region. Most <i>polar</i> birds breed seasonally. |
| preserved | Maintained in its original or existing state. <i>Preserved</i> manuscripts. |
| refrigeration | Deliberately lowering the body's temperature for therapeutic purposes. Commercial <i>refrigeration</i> units. |
| rime | Ice crystals forming a white deposit (especially on objects outside). He does not brush away the frost that <i>rimes</i> his beard. |
| saved | Guarded from injury or destruction. A <i>saved</i> soul. |
| sherbet | A flavoured sweet effervescent powder eaten alone or made into a drink. I went down the local pub for a few <i>sherbets</i> . |
| sleet | Sleet falls. If the temperature rises above freezing it will probably <i>sleet</i> . |
| snow | Fall as snow. We were trudging through deep <i>snow</i> . |
| snowfall | Precipitation falling from clouds in the form of ice crystals. The average <i>snowfall</i> is 75 m a year. |

*A long **snowy** winter.*
- standoffish** Lacking cordiality; unfriendly.
*A **standoffish** manner.*
- winter** Spend the winter.
*The tree has a good crop of berries in **winter**.*
- wintry** Characteristic of or occurring in winter.
*Brown **wintry** grasses.*
