<u>constructive</u>	Not obvious or stated explicitly; derived by inference. <i>Constructive</i> criticism.
effective	Able to accomplish a purpose functioning effectively. A decline in the <b>effective</b> demand.
effectual	Producing or capable of producing an intended result or having a striking effect. Tobacco smoke is the most <b>effectual</b> protection against the midge.
fruiting	Capable of bearing fruit.

productive	Relating to or engaged in the production of goods, crops, or other commodities. A <b>productive</b> vineyard.
<u>profitable</u>	Beneficial; useful. <i>He d had a <b>profitable</b> day.</i>
rewarding	Providing satisfaction; gratifying. A <b>rewarding</b> career as a paramedic.
successful	Having succeeded or being marked by a favorable outcome. A <b>successful</b> actor.
useful	Having a useful function. Aspirins are <b>useful</b> for headaches.
valuable	Extremely useful or important. A <b>valuable</b> antique.
well spent	Resulting favorably.
<u>worthwhile</u>	Worth the time, money, or effort spent; of value or importance. Extra lighting would make a <b>worthwhile</b> contribution to road safety.

gainful	Serving to increase wealth or resources; providing money or other benefit. <i>He soon found gainful employment.</i>
hinterland	The area around or beyond a major town or port. A market town serving its rich agricultural <b>hinterland</b> .
leafy	Resembling a leaf or leaves. Green <b>leafy</b> vegetables.
<u>lucrative</u>	Producing a great deal of profit. A <b>lucrative</b> career as a stand up comedian.
olive	One seeded fruit of the European olive tree usually pickled and used as a relish. His full lips and <b>olive</b> skin.
paying	Yielding a fair profit. A <b>paying</b> job.
productive	(of a prefix, suffix, or other linguistic unit) currently used in forming new words or expressions. <i>His <b>productive</b> years.</i>
<u>profitable</u>	(of a business or activity) yielding profit or financial gain. <i>He d had a <b>profitable</b> day.</i>
<u>prolific</u>	Present in large numbers or quantities; plentiful. A <b>prolific</b> pear tree.
ramify	Spread or branch out; grow and develop in complexity or range. <i>These actions will <b>ramify</b>.</i>
ramose	Having branches. <i>Ramose corals.</i>
remunerative	Earning a salary; paid. <i>Remunerative</i> work.
reproductive	Producing new life or offspring. The <b>reproductive</b> or generative organs.



sapwood	The soft outer layers of recently formed wood between the heartwood and the bark, containing the functioning vascular tissue.
shrub	A low woody perennial plant usually having several major stems.
sinecure	A benefice to which no spiritual or pastoral duties are attached. Political <b>sinecure</b> s for the supporters of ministers.
sprig	A descendant or younger member of a family or social class. A <b>sprig</b> of the French nobility.
topsoil	The top layer of soil. Dry <b>topsoil</b> s are typical in the western Corn Belt.
<u>twig</u>	Branch out in a twiglike manner. <i>Cutaneous nerve <b>twig</b>s.</i>
vegetative	Relating to or concerned with growth rather than sexual reproduction. <i>A dull <b>vegetative</b> lifestyle.</i>
