- *Productive or conducive to producing in abundance.*



Synonyms of "Fruitful" as an adjective (16 Words)

advantageous	Appropriate for achieving a particular end; implies a lack of concern for fairness. <i>The scheme is advantageous to your company.</i>
beneficial	Promoting or enhancing well-being. <i>The process was beneficial to both supplier and customer.</i>
<u>constructive</u>	Not obvious or stated explicitly; derived by inference. <i>Constructive criticism.</i>
effective	Able to accomplish a purpose functioning effectively. <i>A decline in the effective demand.</i>
effectual	Producing or capable of producing an intended result or having a striking effect. <i>Tobacco smoke is the most effectual protection against the midge.</i>
fruiting	Capable of bearing fruit.

gainful	Yielding a fair profit. <i>He soon found gainful employment.</i>
helpful	Giving or ready to give help. <i>Helpful staff.</i>
productive	Relating to or engaged in the production of goods, crops, or other commodities. <i>A productive vineyard.</i>
profitable	Beneficial; useful. <i>He d had a profitable day.</i>
rewarding	Providing satisfaction; gratifying. <i>A rewarding career as a paramedic.</i>
successful	Having succeeded or being marked by a favorable outcome. <i>A successful actor.</i>
useful	Having a useful function. <i>Aspirins are useful for headaches.</i>
valuable	Extremely useful or important. <i>A valuable antique.</i>
well spent	Resulting favorably.
worthwhile	Worth the time, money, or effort spent; of value or importance. <i>Extra lighting would make a worthwhile contribution to road safety.</i>

hinterland	The area around or beyond a major town or port. <i>A market town serving its rich agricultural hinterland.</i>
leafy	Resembling a leaf or leaves. <i>Green leafy vegetables.</i>
lucrative	Producing a great deal of profit. <i>A lucrative career as a stand up comedian.</i>
olive	One seeded fruit of the European olive tree usually pickled and used as a relish. <i>His full lips and olive skin.</i>
paying	Yielding a fair profit. <i>A paying job.</i>
productive	(of a prefix, suffix, or other linguistic unit) currently used in forming new words or expressions. <i>His productive years.</i>
profitable	(of a business or activity) yielding profit or financial gain. <i>He d had a profitable day.</i>
prolific	Present in large numbers or quantities; plentiful. <i>A prolific pear tree.</i>
ramify	Spread or branch out; grow and develop in complexity or range. <i>These actions will ramify.</i>
ramose	Having branches. <i>Ramose corals.</i>
remunerative	Earning a salary; paid. <i>Remunerative work.</i>
reproductive	Producing new life or offspring. <i>The reproductive or generative organs.</i>

sapwood	The soft outer layers of recently formed wood between the heartwood and the bark, containing the functioning vascular tissue.
shrub	A low woody perennial plant usually having several major stems.
sinecure	A benefice to which no spiritual or pastoral duties are attached. <i>Political sinecures for the supporters of ministers.</i>
sprig	A descendant or younger member of a family or social class. <i>A sprig of the French nobility.</i>
topsoil	The top layer of soil. <i>Dry topsoils are typical in the western Corn Belt.</i>
twig	Branch out in a twiglike manner. <i>Cutaneous nerve twigs.</i>
vegetative	Relating to or concerned with growth rather than sexual reproduction. <i>A dull vegetative lifestyle.</i>
