## Synonyms of "Fruition" as a noun (5 Words)

**actualization** Making real or giving the appearance of reality.

The performance of a duty or role as required, pledged, or expected.

**fulfilment** The need to eliminate excess by the security forces in **fulfilment** of their

duties.

materialization Something that comes into existence as a result.

The **materialization** of her dream.

realisation A sale in order to obtain money (as a sale of stock or a sale of the estate

of a bankrupt person) or the money so obtained.



realization Something that is made real or concrete.

**Realization** dawned suddenly.

• The plans have come to fruition rather sooner than expected.

• The apples in the orchards gave a suggestion of sour fruition.

ideational Being of the nature of a notion or concept.

Policy has been shaped by both material and **ideational** factors.



An instance of a wrong or misinterpreted perception of a sensory

experience.

illusion Stripes embellish the surface to create the **illusion** of various wood grain

textures.

Deceptive; illusory. illusive

*Illusive* hopes of finding a better job.

Not based on fact; unreal- F.D.Roosevelt. **imaginary** 

A small child s **imaginary** friends.

Appear or be present when expected. materialize

He plays a teenager whose make believe friend **materialize**s.

Provided with a motive or given incentive for action. motivated A highly **motivated** child can learn almost anything.

Sleep lightly or briefly, especially during the day. nap

She **nap**s everyday after lunch for an hour.

A terrifying or deeply upsetting dream. **nightmare**

Sleep longer or later than one intended. oversleep
