disquietedAfflicted with or marked by anxious uneasiness or trouble or grief.

Spent many **disquieted** moments.

distressed Generalized feeling of distress.

A distressed leather jacket.

downcast Directed downward.

Downcast after his defeat.

downhearted Discouraged; in low spirits.

Feeling discouraged and **downhearted**.

foiled Disappointingly unsuccessful.

Their **foiled** attempt to capture Calais.

In love, or missing the person one loves, so much that one is unable to

lovesick act normally.

Strong men behaving like **lovesick** boys.

Discontented as toward authority.

malcontent The **malcontent** generals saw their role as leaders of this counter

revolution.


Mildly physically distressed. *The* **upset** pitcher of milk.
