## Synonyms of "Fulfill" as a verb (12 Words)

<b>accomplish</b>	To gain with effort. <i>Once this form has been <b>accomplished</b> the applicant needs to secure supporting documents.</i>
<b>action</b>	Take action on deal with. <i>She <b>actioned</b> the company for discrimination.</i>
<b>carry out</b>	Move while supporting, either in a vehicle or in one's hands or on one's body.
<b>carry through</b>	Drink alcohol without showing ill effects.
<b>conform to</b>	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions.
<b>execute</b>	Perform (a skilful action or manoeuvre). <i>He was convicted of treason and <b>executed</b>.</i>
<b>fill</b>	Fill to satisfaction. <i>He <b>filled up</b> on turkey.</i>

<b>fit</b>	Make fit. <i>This piece won't <b>fit</b> into the puzzle.</i>
<b>fulfil</b>	Meet the requirements or expectations of. <i>He wouldn't be able to <b>fulfil</b> his ambition to visit Naples.</i>
<b>live up to</b>	Support oneself.
<b>meet</b>	Meet by design be present at the arrival of. <i>Does this paper <b>meet</b> the requirements for the degree.</i>
<b>satisfy</b>	Fill satisfy or meet a want or need or condition or restriction. <i>There was insufficient collateral to <b>satisfy</b> the loan.</i>

<b>achieve</b>	To gain with effort. <i>People striving to <b>achieve</b>.</i>

<b>append</b>	Add to the very end. <i>The results of the survey are <b>appended</b> to this chapter.</i>
<b>attain</b>	Reach a point in time, or a certain state or level. <i>Clarify your objectives and ways of <b>attaining</b> them.</i>
<b>bulge</b>	Bulge outward. <i>The advance created an eastward facing <b>bulge</b> in the line.</i>
<b>content</b>	Make content. <i>A <b>contented</b> smile.</i>
<b>convince</b>	Make (someone) agree, understand, or realize the truth or validity of something. <i>He had finally <b>convinced</b> several customers of the advantages of his product.</i>
<b>covenant</b>	Enter into a covenant. <i>There was a <b>covenant</b> between them that her name was never to be mentioned.</i>
<b>do</b>	Doctor's degree in osteopathy. <i><b>Do</b> research.</i>
<b>fill</b>	Fill to satisfaction. <i>Community land trusts are a way to <b>fill</b> the pressing need for housing.</i>
<b>fulfil</b>	Meet the requirements or expectations of. <i>Friends whose ill timed speed <b>fulfilled</b> my soon repented deed.</i>
<b>fulfillment</b>	The act of consummating something (a desire or promise etc.)
<b>full</b>	Make something full fill up. <i>Bound in <b>full</b> cloth.</i>
<b>gratification</b>	State of being gratified or satisfied. <i>To my immense <b>gratification</b> he arrived on time.</i>
<b>gratify</b>	Make happy or satisfied. <i>Not all the sexual impulses can be gratified.</i>
<b>implementation</b>	The act of implementing (providing a practical means for accomplishing something); carrying into effect. <i>She was responsible for the <b>implementation</b> of the plan.</i>
<b>indulge</b>	Treat with excessive indulgence. <i>A luxury service used to <b>indulge</b> the chief executive.</i>
<b>indulgence</b>	In the Roman Catholic Church a grant by the Pope of remission of the temporal punishment in purgatory still due for sins after absolution The unrestricted sale of indulgences by pardoners was a widespread abuse during the later Middle Ages. <i>The notice given granted a final <b>indulgence</b> of four weeks.</i>

<b>indulging</b>	The act of indulging or gratifying a desire.
<b>perform</b>	Perform a function. <i>Our 120 million investment in the company is not <b>performing</b> at present.</i>
<b>promise</b>	Make a promise or commitment. <i>I ll bring it straight back she <b>promised</b>.</i>
<b><u>replenish</u></b>	Fill something that had previously been emptied. <i>All creatures need sleep to <b>replenish</b> their energies.</i>
<b>replete</b>	Fill to satisfaction. <i>It is <b>replete</b> with misery.</i>
<b>restock</b>	Replenish (a store) with fresh stock or supplies. <i>He <b>restocked</b> his land with pheasants.</i>
<b>sate</b>	Fill to satisfaction. <i>I am <b>sated</b>.</i>
<b><u>satiate</u></b>	Overeat or eat immodestly; make a pig of oneself. <i>He folded up his newspaper his curiosity <b>satiated</b>.</i>
<b>satisfaction</b>	State of being gratified or satisfied. <i>We were unable to get <b>satisfaction</b> from the local store.</i>
<b>satisfy</b>	Fill satisfy or meet a want or need or condition or restriction. <i>The whole team is working flat out to <b>satisfy</b> demand.</i>
<b>slake</b>	Cause to heat and crumble by treatment with water. <i><b>Slake</b> the lime within a day or two of purchase.</i>
<b>supplement</b>	A supplementary component that improves capability. <i>An earnings related <b>supplement</b> was paid during the first six months of unemployment.</i>
