- comfortable** (especially of clothes or furnishings) providing physical ease and relaxation.
Comfortable suburban houses.
- content** Satisfied or showing satisfaction with things as they are.
*The duke was **content** to act as Regent.*
- contented** Willing to accept something; satisfied.
*I was never **contented** with half measures.*
- gratified** Having received what was desired.
- happy** Eagerly disposed to act or to be of service.
*I can't say they looked too **happy** about it but a deal's a deal.*
- placid** (of a body of water) free from disturbance by heavy waves.
*The **placid** waters of a small lake.*
- pleased** Willing or glad to do something.
*We will be **pleased** to provide an independent appraisal.*

- satisfied** Allayed.
*She was very **satisfied** with the results.*
- serene** Not agitated; without losing self-possession.
*A **serene** expression on her face.*
- untroubled** Not feeling, showing, or affected by anxiety or problems.
***Untroubled** sleep.*



Usage Examples of "Fulfilled" as an adjective

- *I am confident in this role and feel fulfilled.*
- *They lead contented and fulfilled lives.*

- accomplish** Achieve or complete successfully.
*The planes **accomplished** their mission.*
- action** Take action on deal with.
*There were stories of murders and other unnatural **actions**.*
- activity** A thermodynamic quantity representing the effective concentration of a particular component in a solution or other system equal to its concentration multiplied by an activity coefficient.
*There has been a sustained level of **activity** in the economy.*
- actual** Being or reflecting the essential or genuine character of something.
*We saw the **actual** wedding on television.*
- actuality** Existing conditions or facts.
*The building looked as impressive in **actuality** as it did in magazines.*

| reliably | In a consistently good or accurate way. <i>Few of these paintings can be reliably dated.</i> |
