comfortable	(especially of clothes or furnishings) providing physical ease and relaxation. <i>Comfortable suburban houses.</i>
content	Satisfied or showing satisfaction with things as they are. <i>The duke was content to act as Regent.</i>
contented	Willing to accept something; satisfied. <i>I was never contented with half measures.</i>
gratified	Having received what was desired.
happy	Eagerly disposed to act or to be of service. <i>I can't say they looked too happy about it but a deal's a deal.</i>
<u>placid</u>	(of a body of water) free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>The placid waters of a small lake.</i>
<u>pleased</u>	Willing or glad to do something. <i>We will be pleased to provide an independent appraisal.</i>

satisfied

Allayed.

She was very **satisfied** with the results.

serene

Not agitated; without losing self-possession.

A **serene** expression on her face.

untroubled

Not feeling, showing, or affected by anxiety or problems.

Untroubled sleep.

<u>accomplish</u>	Achieve or complete successfully. <i>The planes accomplished their mission.</i>
action	Take action on deal with. <i>There were stories of murders and other unnatural actions.</i>
activity	A thermodynamic quantity representing the effective concentration of a particular component in a solution or other system equal to its concentration multiplied by an activity coefficient. <i>There has been a sustained level of activity in the economy.</i>
<u>actual</u>	Being or reflecting the essential or genuine character of something. <i>We saw the actual wedding on television.</i>
<u>actuality</u>	Existing conditions or facts. <i>The building looked as impressive in actuality as it did in magazines.</i>

attain	Reach a destination, either real or abstract. <i>He attained the rank of Brigadier.</i>
bulge	Bulge outward. <i>The telltale bulge of a concealed weapon.</i>
content	Make content. <i>A contented smile.</i>
covenant	An agreement which brings about a relationship of commitment between God and his people The Jewish faith is based on the biblical covenants made with Abraham Moses and David. <i>They covenanted with Judas for 30 pieces of silver.</i>
do	Doctor s degree in osteopathy. <i>Do nothing.</i>
fill	Any material that fills a space or container. <i>He said the scheme would fill a gap in the market.</i>
fulfill	Meet the requirements or expectations of.
fulfillment	A feeling of satisfaction at having achieved your desires.
garnishment	A court order to an employer to withhold all or part of an employee's wages and to send the money to the court or to the person who won a lawsuit against the employee.
gratification	The act or an instance of satisfying. <i>To my immense gratification he arrived on time.</i>
gratify	Indulge or satisfy (a desire). <i>She was gratified to see the shock in Jim's eyes.</i>
indulge	Treat with excessive indulgence. <i>She was able to indulge a growing passion for literature.</i>
indulging	The act of indulging or gratifying a desire.
meet	Meet by design be present at the arrival of. <i>The curtains failed to meet in the middle.</i>
perform	Carry out or perform an action. <i>We performed a popular Gilbert and Sullivan opera.</i>
promise	Promise to undertake or give. <i>We re promised more winter weather tonight.</i>
reliably	In a consistently good or accurate way. <i>Few of these paintings can be reliably dated.</i>
replete	Deeply filled or permeated. <i>It is replete with misery.</i>

restock	Replenish (a store) with fresh stock or supplies. <i>Work began at once to restock the fishery.</i>
sate	Supply (someone) with as much as or more of something than is desired or can be managed. <i>Sate your appetite at the resort s restaurant.</i>
satisfaction	What is felt to be owed or due to one, especially in reparation of an injustice or wrong. <i>I looked round with satisfaction.</i>
satisfy	Fill satisfy or meet a want or need or condtion ro restriction. <i>Social services is trying to satisfy the needs of so many different groups.</i>
sooth	Truth or reality. <i>In sooth.</i>
supplement	Serve as a supplement to. <i>I looked for a part time job to supplement my income.</i>
<u>vouch</u>	Summon a vouchee into court to warrant or defend a title. <i>The explosive used is of my own formulation and I can vouch for its efficiency.</i>
