<b>bode</b>	Indicate by signs. <i>The 12 per cent interest rate <b>bodes</b> dark days ahead for retailers.</i>
<b>concordat</b>	A signed written agreement between two or more parties (nations) to perform some action. <i>Napoleon I s <b>concordat</b> with the papacy.</i>
<b>content</b>	Make content. <i>He <b>contented</b> himself with one glass of beer per day.</i>
<b><u>covenant</u></b>	An agreement which brings about a relationship of commitment between God and his people The Jewish faith is based on the biblical covenants made with Abraham Moses and David. <i>They <b>covenanted</b> with Judas for 30 pieces of silver.</i>
<b>divination</b>	Successful conjecture by unusual insight or good luck. <i>The Celtic art of <b>divination</b>.</i>

<b>do</b>	Get something done. <i>The air was rancid with the smell of <b>donkey doo</b>.</i>
<b>faithfulness</b>	The quality of being faithful; fidelity. <i><b>Faithfulness</b> in marriage.</i>
<b>forebode</b>	Make a prediction about; tell in advance. <i>I <b>foreboded</b> mischief the moment I heard.</i>
<b>forecasting</b>	A statement made about the future.
<b>foreshadow</b>	Indicate, as with a sign or an omen. <i>Other new measures are <b>foreshadowed</b> in the White Paper.</i>
<b>foretell</b>	Indicate, as with a sign or an omen. <i>A seer had foretold that the earl would assume the throne.</i>
<b><u>forsake</u></b>	Renounce or give up (something valued or pleasant). <i>I won't <b>forsake</b> my vegetarian principles.</i>
<b><u>fulfil</u></b>	Carry out (a duty or role) as required, promised, or expected. <i>Goods must <b>fulfil</b> three basic conditions.</i>
<b><u>gratification</u></b>	A source of pleasure. <i>To my immense <b>gratification</b> he arrived on time.</i>
<b>gratify</b>	Give (someone) pleasure or satisfaction. <i>Not all the sexual impulses can be gratified.</i>
<b><u>indulge</u></b>	Treat with excessive indulgence. <i>The writer <b>indulged</b> in metaphorical language.</i>
<b>indulging</b>	The act of indulging or gratifying a desire.
<b>perform</b>	Give a performance of something. <i>Our 120 million investment in the company is not <b>performing</b> at present.</i>
<b>predict</b>	Make a prediction about tell in advance. <i>He <b>predicts</b> that the trend will continue.</i>
<b>prediction</b>	A statement made about the future. <i>A <b>prediction</b> that economic growth would resume.</i>
<b>prefigure</b>	Indicate by signs. <i>It wasn't as bad as I had <b>prefigured</b>.</i>
<b>presage</b>	A foreboding about what is about to happen. <i>The heavy clouds above the moorland <b>presaged</b> snow.</i>
<b>prognosticate</b>	Indicate, as with a sign or an omen. <i>The economists were prognosticating financial Armageddon.</i>
<b>prognostication</b>	A sign of something about to happen. <i>An unprecedented amount of soul searching and <b>prognostication</b>.</i>

<b>promise</b>	Make a promise or commitment. <i>Dawn came with the <b>promise</b> of fine weather.</i>
<b><u>prophecy</u></b>	A prediction uttered under divine inspiration. <i>A bleak <b>prophecy</b> of war and ruin.</i>
<b>recitation</b>	Written matter that is recited from memory. <i>The program included songs and <b>recitations</b> of well loved poems.</i>
<b>satisfaction</b>	Christ's atonement for sin. <i>I demand the <b>satisfaction</b> of a gentleman.</i>
<b>satisfy</b>	Fill satisfy or meet a want or need or condition or restriction. <i>The whole team is working flat out to <b>satisfy</b> demand.</i>
<b>soothsayer</b>	Someone who makes predictions of the future (usually on the basis of special knowledge).
