## Associations of "Fully fledged" (30 Words)

<b>abundantly</b>	Extremely. <i>The plant grows <b>abundantly</b> in the wild.</i>
<b>adequate</b>	Satisfactory or acceptable in quality or quantity. <i>The food was <b>adequate</b>.</i>
<b>all</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent whole is often used informally for wholly. <i>A <b>totally</b> new situation.</i>
<b><u>altogether</u></b>	Informal terms for nakedness. <i><b>Altogether</b> I m sorry it happened.</i>
<b>ample</b>	Fairly large. <i>She stood with her hands on her <b>ample</b> hips.</i>
<b>amply</b>	To an ample degree or in an ample manner. <i>The evidence <b>amply</b> or fully confirms our suspicions.</i>
<b>automated</b>	Operated by largely automatic equipment. <i>A fully <b>automated</b> process.</i>
<b>completely</b>	So as to be complete; with everything necessary. <i>It was <b>completely</b> different from what we expected.</i>
<b><u>conversant</u></b>	Well informed about or knowing thoroughly. <i><b>Conversant</b> with business trends.</i>
<b>copiously</b>	In large quantities. <i>I was drinking <b>copiously</b>.</i>
<b>entire</b>	Constituting the undiminished entirety lacking nothing essential especially not damaged. <i>Was able to keep the collection <b>entire</b> during his lifetime.</i>
<b>entirely</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’). <i><b>Entirely</b> satisfied with the meal.</i>

<b>equipped</b>	Prepared with proper equipment. <i><b>Equipped</b> for service in the Arctic.</i>
<b>fairly</b>	To certain extent or degree. <i>He is <b>fairly</b> clever with computers.</i>
<b>gamut</b>	The lowest note in the gamut scale. <i>The whole <b>gamut</b> of human emotion.</i>
<b>generic</b>	Applicable to an entire class or group. <i>The plot of the film isn't just <b>generic</b> it's insultingly stupid.</i>
<b>grown</b>	Fully developed. <i>A <b>grown</b> woman.</i>
<b>mature</b>	Fully developed or matured and ready to be eaten or used. <i>When the policy <b>matures</b> it pays off the loan.</i>
<b>matured</b>	Fully ripe; at the height of bloom.
<b>outright</b>	Wholly and completely. <i>He was killed <b>outright</b>.</i>
<b>penetrable</b>	Possible to understand; understandable. <i><b>Penetrable</b> defenses.</i>
<b>perfect</b>	The perfect tense. <i><b>Perfect</b> manners.</i>
<b>perfectly</b>	In a perfect or faultless way. <i>A <b>perfectly</b> idiotic idea.</i>
<b>quite</b>	To the utmost or most absolute extent or degree; absolutely; completely. <i>I <b>quite</b> agree.</i>
<b>ripen</b>	Cause to ripen or develop fully. <i>The sun <b>ripens</b> the fruit.</i>
<b>sufficiency</b>	Self sufficiency or independence of character especially of an arrogant or imperious sort. <i>A <b>sufficiency</b> of good food.</i>
<b>sufficient</b>	Of a quantity that can fulfill a need or requirement but without being abundant. <i>They had <b>sufficient</b> resources to survive.</i>
<b>totally</b>	Completely; absolutely. <i>So then Julie like <b>totally</b> dumps her boyfriend Tommy.</i>
<b>utterly</b>	Completely and without qualification; absolutely. <i><b>Utterly</b> miserable.</i>

To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent whole is often used informally for wholly.
