abundant	Having plenty of. <i>An abundant supply of water.</i>
abundantly	Extremely. <i>They were abundantly supplied with food.</i>
adequacy	The quality of being sufficient for the end in view. <i>The adequacy of testing procedures.</i>
adequate	About average; acceptable. <i>She was adequate to the job.</i>
adequately	To a satisfactory or acceptable extent. <i>The job requirements were not adequately explained.</i>
affluent	An affluent person a person who is financially well off. <i>An affluent banker.</i>
ample	Fairly large in size. <i>There is ample time for discussion.</i>
amply	Enough or more than enough; plentifully. <i>They were fully or amply fed.</i>
appropriately	In a manner that is suitable or proper in the circumstances. <i>Walls of raw concrete form a neutral yet appropriately rugged backdrop for the various objects.</i>
bountiful	Given or giving freely. <i>This bountiful God has thought of everything.</i>
bountifulness	The property of copious abundance.
bounty	A sum paid for killing or capturing a person or animal. <i>For millennia the people along the Nile have depended entirely on its bounty.</i>
copious	Profuse in speech or ideas. <i>She took copious notes.</i>

copiously	In an expansive or wide-ranging way. <i>His book is copiously annotated with references to the current debates.</i>
exceeding	Extremely exceedingly. <i>A night of exceeding darkness.</i>
<u>fairly</u>	To a moderately high degree. <i>He could not fairly be accused of wasting police time.</i>
full	Make a garment fuller by pleating or gathering. <i>A sky full of stars.</i>
fully	No less or fewer than (used to emphasize an amount). <i>I fully understand the fears of the workers.</i>
lot	Divide into lots as of land for example. <i>Has a happy lot.</i>
<u>moderately</u>	To a moderately sufficient extent or degree. <i>Both hotels are moderately priced.</i>
passable	(of a route or road) clear of obstacles and able to be travelled on. <i>The road is passable.</i>
plentiful	Existing in or yielding great quantities; abundant. <i>Rhinoceroses were once plentiful here.</i>
plentitude	A full supply.
profusion	The property of being extremely abundant. <i>The profusion of detail.</i>
replete	Fill to satisfaction. <i>I went out into the sun drenched streets again replete and relaxed.</i>
<u>suffice</u>	Be enough or adequate. <i>A B grade doesn't suffice to get me into medical school.</i>
sufficiency	Self sufficiency or independence of character especially of an arrogant or imperious sort. <i>There is more than a sufficiency of lawyers in this country.</i>
<u>sufficient</u>	Of a quantity that can fulfill a need or requirement but without being abundant. <i>Sufficient food.</i>
suitability	The quality of having the properties that are right for a specific purpose. <i>Her superiors had doubts about her suitability for the job.</i>
validation	Recognition or affirmation that a person or their feelings or opinions are valid or worthwhile. <i>New courses subject to validation include an MSc in Urban Forestry.</i>
