

- The state of being combined into one body.
- Referring to food or cooking which incorporates elements of both Eastern and Western cuisine.
- A nuclear reaction in which nuclei combine to form more massive nuclei with the simultaneous release of energy.
- The act of fusing (or melting) together.
- \bullet The combining of images from the two eyes to form a single visual percept.
- An occurrence that involves the production of a union.
- The process of causing a material or object to melt with intense heat so as to join with another.


