Synonyms of "Gangster" as a noun (13 Words)

A robber or outlaw belonging to a gang and typically operating in an isolated

bandit or lawless area.

The **bandit** produced a weapon and demanded money.

criminal Someone who has committed a crime or has been legally convicted of a crime.

These men are dangerous **criminal**s.

desperado A desperate or reckless person, especially a criminal.

hoodlum An aggressive and violent young criminal.

They were the professional gangsters of New York **hoodlum**s and racketeers.

lawbreaker A person who breaks the law.

mobster A criminal who is a member of gang.

A person who has broken the law, especially one who remains at large or is a

outlaw fugitive.

Bands of **outlaw**s held up trains.



racketeer Someone who commits crimes for profit (especially one who obtains money by

fraud or extortion.

robber A person who commits robbery.

ruffian A violent criminal or troublemaker.


A cruel and brutal fellow.

A gang of **tough**s.

The person or thing responsible for specified problems, harm, or damage.

A pantomime **villain**.
