- A member of a gang of violent criminals.






Synonyms of "Gangster" as a noun (13 Words)

| <u>bandit</u> | A robber or outlaw belonging to a gang and typically operating in an isolated or lawless area. The bandit produced a weapon and demanded money. |

| criminal | Someone who has committed a crime or has been legally convicted of a crime. <i>These men are dangerous criminals.</i> |
| desperado | A desperate or reckless person, especially a criminal. |
| hoodlum | An aggressive and violent young criminal. They were the professional gangsters of New York hoodlum s and racketeers. |
| lawbreaker | A person who breaks the law. |
| mobster | A criminal who is a member of gang. |
| <u>outlaw</u> | A person who has broken the law, especially one who remains at large or is a fugitive. Bands of outlaw s held up trains. |



| racketeer | Someone who commits crimes for profit (especially one who obtains money by fraud or extortion. |

| <u>robber</u> | A person who commits robbery. |
| ruffian | A violent criminal or troublemaker. |
| <u>tough</u> | A cruel and brutal fellow. A gang of tough s. |
| <u>villain</u> | The person or thing responsible for specified problems, harm, or damage. <i>A pantomime villain</i> . |
