## **Garden as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Garden" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “garden” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Ornamental grounds laid out for public enjoyment and recreation.*
- *A piece of ground adjoining a house, in which grass, flowers, and shrubs may be grown.*
- *The flowers or vegetables or fruits or herbs that are cultivated in a garden.*
- *A large public hall.*
- *A plot of ground where plants are cultivated.*
- *A yard or lawn adjoining a house.*
- *A street or square.*



## Synonyms of "Garden" as a noun (2 Words)

**piece of land** A serving that has been cut from a larger portion.

**plot**

The story that is told in a novel or play or movie etc.  
*He outlined his idea for a movie **plot**.*

## Associations of "Garden" (30 Words)

<b><u>arboreal</u></b>	Living in trees. <i>Arboreal apes.</i>
<b><u>arboretum</u></b>	A facility where trees and shrubs are cultivated for exhibition.
<b>aster</b>	A plant of a large genus that includes the Michaelmas daisy, typically having purple or pink rayed flowers.
<b>azalea</b>	Any of numerous ornamental shrubs grown for their showy flowers of various colors.
<b>botanical</b>	Of or relating to plants or botany. <i>Botanical garden.</i>
<b>botany</b>	The branch of biology that studies plants. <i>The botany of China.</i>
<b>conservatory</b>	A greenhouse in which plants are arranged in a pleasing manner. <i>Keep plant cuttings in a frost free conservatory or greenhouse.</i>

<b>dendroid</b>	(of a plant, marine invertebrate, or structure) tree-shaped; branching.
<b>efflorescence</b>	Rapid growth or development. <i>Efflorescence stains on the walls.</i>
<b>entomology</b>	The branch of zoology concerned with the study of insects.
<b>flora</b>	A book or other work detailing the plants of a particular region or habitat. <i>Britain's native <b>flora</b>.</i>
<b>flower</b>	A flower together with its stalk picked for use as a decoration. <i>A bunch of <b>flowers</b>.</i>
<b>flowering</b>	Producing flowers at a specified time or of a specified type. <i><b>Flowering</b> dogwood.</i>
<b>gardening</b>	The activity of tending and cultivating a garden, especially as a pastime. <i>Her love of <b>gardening</b>.</i>
<b>grass</b>	Cover with grass. <i>Anglers <b>grassed</b> 294 trout.</i>
<b>grove</b>	A small growth of trees without underbrush. <i>An olive <b>grove</b>.</i>
<b>herbaceous</b>	Denoting or relating to herbs (in the botanical sense).
<b>herbarium</b>	A room or building housing a herbarium.
<b>horticultural</b>	Of or relating to the cultivation of plants. <i>The <b>horticultural</b> industry.</i>
<b>horticulture</b>	The art or practice of garden cultivation and management. <i>Maize and manioc <b>horticulture</b>.</i>
<b>hothouse</b>	An environment that encourages rapid growth or development, especially in a stifling or intense way. <i>The <b>hothouse</b> atmosphere of the college.</i>
<b>microbiology</b>	The branch of science that deals with microorganisms.
<b>ornithology</b>	The branch of zoology that studies birds.
<b>patio</b>	A paved outdoor area adjoining a house. <i>A <b>patio</b> table and chairs.</i>
<b>plant</b>	Place a plant in the ground out of doors so it can grow especially after growing it from seed in an indoor environment. <i>The garden is <b>planted</b> with herbs.</i>
<b><u>plantation</u></b>	An estate where cash crops are grown on a large scale (especially in tropical areas). <i>New conifer <b>plantations</b>.</i>
<b>rooftop</b>	The top of a (usually flat) roof. <i>A <b>rooftop</b> garden.</i>

**tare** A vetch, especially the common vetch.

**tree** Force a hunted animal to take refuge in a tree.  
*The hunters **treed** the bear with dogs and killed it.*

**vegetation** An abnormal growth or excrescence (especially a warty excrescence on the valves of the heart).  
*Their holiday was spent in sleep and **vegetation**.*
