belt	A belt of a specified colour marking the attainment of a particular level in judo karate or similar sports. <i>A sword <b>belt</b></i> .
blouse	A type of jacket worn as part of military uniform. I <b>blouse</b> d my trousers over my boots.
bodice	A sleeveless, close-fitting waist-length garment, typically lacing up in the front, worn over a dress or blouse or as underwear.
chiffon	A sheer fabric of silk or rayon. <i>Chiffon cake</i> .



clothes	Bedclothes. Baby <b>clothes</b> .
corset	Dress with a corset.
<u>crease</u>	Make wrinkles or creases on a smooth surface make a pressed folded or wrinkled line in. <i>He was caught in the <b>crease</b> without the puck.</i>
<u>crumple</u>	Become wrinkled or crumpled or creased. The bumper <b>crumple</b> d as it glanced off the wall.
<u>dress</u>	Dress or groom with elaborate care. Battle <b>dress</b> .
hem	Utter hem or ahem. <i>Let down the <b>hem</b></i> .
jacket	The dust jacket of a book. <i>Potatoes cooked in their <b>jacket</b>s.</i>
negligee	A loose dressing gown for women. A black silk <b>negligee</b> .
<u>outfit</u>	Provide with equipment. A first aid <b>outfit</b> .
<u>pants</u>	Underpants or knickers. <i>Corduroy <b>pants</b>.</i>
pleat	Pleat or gather into a ruffle. She was absently <b>pleat</b> ing her skirt between her fingers.
pucker	Draw together into folds or puckers. The baby stirred <b>pucker</b> ing up its face.
<u>robe</u>	Clothe formally especially in ecclesiastical robes. <i>He was dressed in his archbishop s <b>robe</b>s after some function.</i>
seam	Put together with a seam. Our stockings are <b>seam</b> ed by hand.
<u>shirt</u>	Put a shirt on. Smith increased his chances of a Great Britain <b>shirt</b> with a penalty shot save.
skirt	A garment fastened around the waist and hanging down around the legs, worn by women and girls. <i>He did not go through the city but</i> <b>skirt</b> <i>ed it.</i>
sleeve	A drogue towed by an aircraft. An album <b>sleeve</b> .



<u>stitch</u>	Make mend or join something with stitches. <i>He had to have sixteen <b>stitch</b>es to his head.</i>	
sweater	A person who perspires. A close knit wool <b>sweater</b> for icy weather.	
tuck	Make a tuck or several folds in. The colonel was coming toward her his gun <b>tuck</b> ed under his arm.	
undergarment An article of underclothing.		
underwear	Undergarment worn next to the skin and under the outer garments.	
waistline	The shaping and position of the waist of a garment. The changing <b>waistline</b> in women s fashions.	
wear	The wearing of something or the state of being worn as clothing. The firefighters were <b>wear</b> ing breathing apparatus.	
wrinkle	Gather or contract into wrinkles or folds pucker. He sniffed and <b>wrinkle</b> d his nose.
