- *Store grain.*
- *Gather or collect (something, especially information or approval).*
- *Store; deposit.*

- Acquire or deserve by one's efforts or actions.

Synonyms of "Garner" as a verb (16 Words)

<u>accumulate</u>	Gather; build up. <i>Her goal was to accumulate a huge fortune.</i>
amass	Gather together in a crowd or group. <i>The soldiers were amassing from all parts of Spain.</i>
<u>assemble</u>	Translate (a program) from a higher-level programming language into machine code. <i>Assemble the program and produce a file suitable to input to the simulator.</i>
<u>cache</u>	Store data in a cache memory. <i>The operating system tries to cache every disk operation.</i>
collect	Gather or collect. <i>A rider should want to be able to collect a horse when hacking.</i>
<u>conceal</u>	Prevent from being seen or discovered. <i>A line of sand dunes concealed the distant sea.</i>
<u>earn</u>	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>She earns a lot in her new job.</i>
<u>gather</u>	Collect or gather. <i>I gather you have not done your homework.</i>
hide	Be or go into hiding; keep out of sight, as for protection and safety. <i>Hide the money.</i>
load	Fill or place a load on. <i>Load the cassette into the camcorder.</i>
<u>pack</u>	Hike with a backpack. <i>A pneumatic igloo tent that packs away compactly.</i>
pull together	Strain abnormally.
<u>secrete</u>	(of a cell, gland, or organ) produce and discharge (a substance). <i>Insulin is secreted in response to rising levels of glucose in the blood.</i>
<u>store</u>	Find a place for and put away for storage. <i>The bear stores fat for the period of hibernation when he doesn't eat.</i>
stow	Pack or store (an object) carefully and neatly in a particular place. <i>Stow the cart.</i>
win	Be the winner in a contest or competition be victorious. <i>Many lived to win the great cave.</i>

- *The crop was ready to be reaped and garnered.*

acquire	Come to have or undergo a change of (physical features and attributes). <i>I managed to acquire all the books I needed.</i>
acquired	Gotten through environmental forces. <i>Acquired characteristics such as a suntan or a broken nose cannot be passed on.</i>
aggregate	Amount in the aggregate to. <i>Raspberries are aggregate fruits.</i>
allowance	Give someone a sum of money as an allowance. <i>The elderly receive a heating allowance every winter.</i>
amass	Collect or gather. <i>He amassed a fortune estimated at close to a million pounds.</i>
attainable	Capable of being attained or accomplished. <i>An attainable target.</i>
collate	Collect and combine (texts, information, or data). <i>Collate the papers.</i>
collect	Gather or collect. <i>By all best conjectures I collect Thou art to be my fatal enemy.</i>
convergent	Relating to or denoting evolutionary convergence. <i>There are a number of convergent reasons for the growth of interest in pragmatics.</i>
convoke	Call together. <i>She sent messages convoking a Council of Ministers.</i>
cumulate	An igneous rock formed by gravitational settling of particles in a magma. <i>They appear to have formed from cumulates in the root of a magma chamber.</i>
datum	An item of factual information derived from measurement or research. <i>This is not a permanent and unchangeable datum.</i>

deserved	Properly deserved. <i>A deserved standing ovation.</i>
earn	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>He earns his living as a lorry driver.</i>
gain	Increase in value. <i>I have gained weight over the years.</i>
gather	A part of a garment that is gathered. <i>I gathered that they were old friends.</i>
gathered	Brought together in one place. <i>The gathered folds of the skirt.</i>
glean	Gather (leftover grain) after a harvest. <i>The information is gleaned from press cuttings.</i>
harvest	Gather a crop as a harvest. <i>Farmers work longer hours during the harvest.</i>
infamous	Known widely and usually unfavorably. <i>The infamous Benedict Arnold.</i>
infamy	A state of extreme dishonor- F.D.Roosevelt. <i>A day that will live in infamy.</i>
notoriety	The state of being known for some unfavorable act or quality. <i>The song has gained some notoriety in the press.</i>
obtain	Be valid, applicable, or true. <i>How did you obtain the visa.</i>
philatelist	A collector and student of postage stamps.
procure	Obtain (something), especially with care or effort. <i>He procured extra cigarettes even though they were rationed.</i>
reap	Gather, as of natural products. <i>The company is poised to reap the benefits of this investment.</i>
reconvene	Convene or cause to convene again, especially after a pause in proceedings. <i>Parliament reconvenes on 1st June.</i>
retrieval	The cognitive operation of accessing information in memory. <i>Online information retrieval.</i>
scythe	Cut with a scythe. <i>Attacking players can scythe through defences.</i>
