- *An explosive mixture of firedamp with air.*
- *Gas generated in the alimentary canal; flatulence.*
- *The state of matter distinguished from the solid and liquid states by: relatively low density and viscosity; relatively great expansion and contraction with changes in pressure and temperature; the ability to diffuse readily; and the spontaneous tendency*

*to become distributed uniformly throughout any container.*

- *An entertaining or amusing person or situation.*
- *A volatile flammable mixture of hydrocarbons (hexane and heptane and octane etc.) derived from petroleum; used mainly as a fuel in internal-combustion engines.*
- *A pedal that controls the throttle valve.*
- *Gas or vapour used as a poisonous agent in warfare.*
- *Used in reference to power or the accelerator of a car.*
- *A substance or matter in a state in which it will expand freely to fill the whole of a container, having no fixed shape (unlike a solid) and no fixed volume (unlike a liquid).*
- *A gaseous anaesthetic such as nitrous oxide, used in dentistry.*
- *The state of matter distinguished from the solid and liquid states by: relatively low density and viscosity; relatively great expansion and contraction with changes in pressure and temperature; the ability to diffuse readily; and the sp.*
- *A gaseous substance that cannot be liquefied by the application of pressure alone.*
- *A state of excessive gas in the alimentary canal.*
- *A flammable gas used as a fuel.*
- *A fossil fuel in the gaseous state; used for cooking and heating homes.*
- *Enjoyment, amusement, or fun.*
- *A fluid in the gaseous state having neither independent shape nor volume and being able to expand indefinitely.*

<b>gasolene</b>	A volatile flammable mixture of hydrocarbons (hexane and heptane and octane etc.) derived from petroleum; used mainly as a fuel in internal-combustion engines.
<b>gasoline</b>	Refined petroleum used as fuel for internal combustion engines; petrol.
<b><u>gun</u></b>	A gunman. <i>A twenty <b>gun</b> salute.</i>
<b>hoot</b>	A shout expressing scorn or disapproval. <i>The audience broke into <b>hoots</b> of laughter.</i>
<b>joker</b>	A playing card that is usually printed with a picture of a jester. <i>Some <b>joker</b> is blocking the driveway.</i>

<b>execute</b>	Make (a legal instrument) valid by signing or sealing it. <i>He would be <b>executed</b> if he fell into rebel hands.</i>
<b>gasconade</b>	Show off.
<b>go on</b>	To be spent or finished.
<b>gossip</b>	Engage in gossip. <i>They would start <b>gossiping</b> about her as soon as she left.</i>
<b>guillotine</b>	Kill by cutting the head off with a guillotine. <i>The French <b>guillotined</b> many Vietnamese while they occupied the country.</i>
<b>hang</b>	Be killed by hanging. <i>I guess I wasn't cool enough to <b>hang</b> with them anymore.</i>
<b>have a conversation</b>	Cause to be born.
<b>jabber</b>	Talk in a noisy, excited, or declamatory manner. <i>He <b>jabbered</b> on about football.</i>
<b>prate</b>	Speak (about unimportant matters) rapidly and incessantly. <i>I heard him <b>prate</b> on for at least an hour and a half.</i>
<b>prattle</b>	Talk at length in a foolish or inconsequential way. <i>She began to <b>prattle</b> on about her visit to the dentist.</i>
<b>put before a firing squad</b>	Formulate in a particular style or language.
<b>run on</b>	Come unraveled or undone as if by snagging.
<b>send to the chair</b>	To cause or order to be taken, directed, or transmitted to another place.
<b>send to the electric chair</b>	Transfer.
<b>send to the gallows</b>	Cause to go somewhere.



<b>send to the gas chamber</b>	Cause to be directed or transmitted to another place.
<b>send to the gibbet</b>	Cause to be directed or transmitted to another place.
<b><u>shoot</u></b>	Shoot game in or on an estate cover etc. <i>The troops were ordered to <b>shoot</b> to kill.</i>
<b>shoot a line</b>	Score. (of a musical instrument or other object) make a sound when functioning.
<b>speak</b>	<i>Insufficient air circulates for the pipes to <b>speak</b>.</i>
<b><u>stone</u></b>	Kill by throwing stones at. <i>The honey <b>stoned</b> eighteenth century city.</i>
<b>stone to death</b>	Kill by throwing stones at.
<b>swash</b>	Dash a liquid upon or against. <i>The water <b>swashed</b> and rippled around the car wheels.</i>
<b>talk</b>	Exchange thoughts talk with. <i>She <b>talks</b> a lot of nonsense.</i>
<b>tittle-tattle</b>	Speak (about unimportant matters) rapidly and incessantly.
<b><u>tout</u></b>	Spy out the movements and condition of (a racehorse in training) in order to gain information to be used when betting. <i>Shop managers would stand in the street <b>touting</b> for business.</i>

- airy** (of a room or building) spacious, well lit, and well ventilated.  
*An **airy** apparition.*
- ammonia** A water solution of ammonia.
- bleach** The act of whitening something by bleaching it exposing it to sunlight or using a chemical bleaching agent.  
***Bleach** the laundry.*
- bromine** A nonmetallic heavy volatile corrosive dark brown liquid element belonging to the halogens; found in sea water.
- carbon** Carbon dioxide or other gaseous carbon compounds released into the atmosphere associated with climate change.  
*A bike with a **carbon** frame.*

<b>chlorine</b>	A common nonmetallic element belonging to the halogens; best known as a heavy yellow irritating toxic gas; used to purify water and as a bleaching agent and disinfectant; occurs naturally only as a salt (as in sea water).
<b>damper</b>	A person or thing that has a subduing or inhibiting effect. <i>Rain put a <b>damper</b> on our picnic plans.</i>
<b>dioxide</b>	An oxide containing two atoms of oxygen in its molecule or empirical formula.
<b>dyspepsia</b>	Indigestion.
<b>extinguish</b>	Extinguish by crushing. <i>Rights of common pasture were <b>extinguished</b>.</i>
<b>extraction</b>	The action of extracting something, especially using effort or force. <i>Mineral <b>extraction</b>.</i>
<b>flammable</b>	Easily set on fire. <i>The use of highly <b>flammable</b> materials.</i>
<b>flatulence</b>	Pompously embellished language. <i>Foods that may cause <b>flatulence</b>.</i>
<b>fuel</b>	Take in fuel as of a ship. <i><b>Fuel</b> aircraft ships and cars.</i>
<b>gasoline</b>	Refined petroleum used as fuel for internal combustion engines; petrol.
<b>gastritis</b>	Inflammation of the lining of the stomach.
<b>halon</b>	Any of a number of unreactive gaseous compounds of carbon with bromine and other halogens, used in fire extinguishers, but now known to damage the ozone layer.
<b>hydrogen</b>	A nonmetallic univalent element that is normally a colorless and odorless highly flammable diatomic gas; the simplest and lightest and most abundant element in the universe.
<b>ignite</b>	Arouse or inflame (an emotion or situation). <i>The ostentatious way of living of the rich <b>ignites</b> the hatred of the poor.</i>
<b>indigestion</b>	A disorder of digestive function characterized by discomfort or heartburn or nausea. <i>You know crisps give me <b>indigestion</b>.</i>
<b>iodine</b>	A tincture consisting of a solution of iodine in ethyl alcohol applied topically to wounds as an antiseptic.
<b>methane</b>	A colorless odorless gas used as a fuel.
<b>monoxide</b>	An oxide containing just one atom of oxygen in the molecule.

- nitrogen** The chemical element of atomic number 7 a colourless odourless unreactive gas that forms about 78 per cent of the earth s atmosphere Liquid nitrogen made by distilling liquid air boils at 77 4 kelvins 195 8 C and is used as a coolant.
- oxygen** A colourless, odourless reactive gas, the chemical element of atomic number 8 and the life-supporting component of the air.  
*An **oxygen** supply.*
- petroleum** A liquid mixture of hydrocarbons which is present in suitable rock strata and can be extracted and refined to produce fuels including petrol, paraffin, and diesel oil; oil.
- reflux** Boil or cause to boil in circumstances such that the vapour returns to the stock of liquid after condensing.  
*The mixture was heated at **reflux** under nitrogen.*
- sulfur** Treat with sulphur in order to preserve.
- vent** A slit in a garment (as in the back seam of a jacket).  
*We **vent** our spleen on drug barons.*
- ventilate** Give expression or utterance to.  
*I pull out a gun and **ventilate** her dinner companion.*
