- *An arrangement of slots into which the gear lever of a motor vehicle moves to engage each gear.*
- *A computer circuit with several inputs but only one output that can be activated by particular combinations of inputs.*
- *An electric circuit with an output which depends on the combination of several inputs.*
- *The money taken for admission to a sports ground for an event.*
- *A hinged barrier used to close an opening in a wall, fence, or hedge.*
- *The part of a field-effect transistor to which a signal is applied to control the resistance of the conductive channel of the device.*
- *A hinged or sliding barrier for controlling the flow of water.*
- *A movable barrier in a fence or wall.*
- *A gateway.*
- *A device resembling a gate in structure or function.*
- *The number of people who pay to enter a sports ground for an event.*
- *A device for holding each frame of a film in position behind the lens of a camera or projector.*

- *Total admission receipts at a sports event.*
- *An exit from an airport building to an aircraft.*
- *Passageway (as in an air terminal) where passengers can embark or disembark.*
- *A mountain pass or other natural passage.*

**barrier**

A circumstance or obstacle that keeps people or things apart or prevents communication or progress.

*A language **barrier**.*

**doorway**

The entrance (the space in a wall) through which you enter or leave a room or building; the space that a door can close.

*Beth stood there in the **doorway**.*

**egress**

The reappearance of a celestial body after an eclipse.

*Direct means of access and **egress** for passengers.*

<b><u>entrance</u></b>	The act of entering. <i>The <b>entrance</b> to a tunnel.</i>
<b><u>exit</u></b>	The act of going out. <i>The brief soliloquy following Clarence s <b>exit</b>.</i>
<b>five-barred gate</b>	A movable barrier in a fence or wall.
<b>gateway</b>	A frame or arch built around or over a gate. <i>We turned into a <b>gateway</b> leading to a cottage.</i>
<b>logic gate</b>	A system of reasoning.
<b>lychgate</b>	A roofed gateway to a churchyard, formerly used at burials for sheltering a coffin until the clergyman's arrival.
<b>opening</b>	The act of opening something. <i>I covered the <b>opening</b> of a new computerized diagnosis unit.</i>
<b>turnstile</b>	A mechanical gate consisting of revolving horizontal arms fixed to a vertical post, allowing only one person at a time to pass through.
<b>wicket</b>	Cricket equipment consisting of a set of three stumps topped by crosspieces; used in playing cricket. <i>When they inspected the <b>wicket</b> they found it being rolled by some prisoners.</i>
<b>wicket gate</b>	A computer circuit with several inputs but only one output that can be activated by particular combinations of inputs.

- admittance** The process or fact of entering or being allowed to enter a place or institution.  
*People were unable to gain **admittance** to the hall.*
- bang** Leap jerk bang.  
*He **banged** home four penalties in the opening twenty minutes.*
- closed** With shutters closed.  
*A **closed** shop.*
- compressed** Reduced in volume by pressure.  
*With lips **compressed**.*
- dam** Build a dam across a river or lake.  
*The closed lock gates **dammed** up the canal.*

<b>door</b>	The entrance the space in a wall through which you enter or leave a room or building the space that a door can close. <i>They live two <b>doors</b> up the street from us.</i>
<b>doorway</b>	The entrance (the space in a wall) through which you enter or leave a room or building; the space that a door can close. <i>He stuck his head in the <b>doorway</b>.</i>
<b>embankment</b>	A bank of earth or stone built to carry a road or railway over an area of low ground. <i>A railway <b>embankment</b>.</i>
<b>entrance</b>	The right, means, or opportunity to enter somewhere or be a member of an institution, society, or other body. <i>She made a grand <b>entrance</b>.</i>
<b>fascinate</b>	Attract the strong attention and interest of (someone). <i>The serpent <b>fascinates</b> its prey.</i>
<b>floodgate</b>	A gate that can be opened or closed to admit or exclude water, especially the lower gate of a lock. <i>His lawsuit could open the <b>floodgates</b> for thousands of similar claims.</i>
<b>gateway</b>	A place regarded as giving access to another place. <i>We turned into a <b>gateway</b> leading to a cottage.</i>
<b>inviting</b>	Attractive and tempting. <i>The sea down there looks so <b>inviting</b>.</i>
<b>jamb</b>	A side post or surface of a doorway, window, or fireplace. <i>He leaned against the door <b>jamb</b>.</i>
<b>lintel</b>	Horizontal beam used as a finishing piece over a door or window.
<b>lock</b>	Fasten with a lock. <i>He is treated like an unpaid servant and <b>locked</b> in his room.</i>
<b>mesmerize</b>	Hypnotize (someone). <i>He was <b>mesmerized</b> when at the point of death.</i>
<b>penstock</b>	A sluice for controlling or directing the flow of water.
<b>porch</b>	A covered shelter projecting in front of the entrance of a building. <i>Daniel and Lydia sat out on the <b>porch</b> for many hours.</i>
<b>portal</b>	A grand and imposing entrance (often extended metaphorically). <i>Many healthcare providers already utilize <b>portals</b> through which a patient can access test results.</i>
<b>shut</b>	Move so that an opening or passage is obstructed make shut. <i>They ought to <b>shut</b> the path up to that terrible cliff.</i>

<b>shutdown</b>	A turning off of a computer or computer system. <i>The build up was pushing the reactor towards <b>shutdown</b>.</i>
<b>shutter</b>	Close the shutters of a window or building. <i>The city was gripped by economic forces that were squeezing its tax base and <b>shuttering</b> its factories.</i>
<b>sill</b>	A shelf or slab of stone, wood, or metal at the foot of a window opening or doorway.
<b><u>slam</u></b>	Dance the slam dance. <i>Charlie <b>slammed</b> down the phone.</i>
<b>sluice</b>	Conduit that carries a rapid flow of water controlled by a sluiceway. <i><b>Sluice</b> the earth.</i>
<b>spellbind</b>	To render motionless, as with a fixed stare or by arousing terror or awe. <i>The singer held the audience <b>spellbound</b>.</i>
<b>threshold</b>	The sill of a door; a horizontal piece of wood or stone that forms the bottom of a doorway and offers support when passing through a doorway. <i>Their water would meet the safety <b>threshold</b> of 50 milligrams of nitrates per litre.</i>
<b><u>toll</u></b>	Charge a toll for the use of a bridge or road. <i>A <b>toll</b> bridge.</i>
<b><u>window</u></b>	An opening that resembles a window in appearance or function. <i>The expanded <b>window</b> will give us time to catch the thieves.</i>
