A forbidding scowl.

forlorn Pitifully sad and abandoned or lonely.

A **forlorn** cause.

**gloomy** Filled with melancholy and despondency.

**Gloomy** at the thought of what he had to face.

Not to be placated or appeased or moved by entreaty.

She was looking **grim**.

**haggard** Showing the wearing effects of overwork or care or suffering.

Her face was drawn and **haggard** from sleeplessness.

Of textures that are rough to the touch or substances consisting of

**harsh** relatively large particles.

Had **harsh** words.

**hollow-eyed** Characteristic of the bony face of a cadaver.

Of a person lanky.

The man had **lank** brown greasy hair.



**lantern-jawed** Having a protruding jaw giving the face a gaunt appearance.

Lacking excess flesh.

lean A lean budget.

Sounding as if the nose were pinched.

Her pinched toes in her pointed shoes were killing her.

raddled Used until no longer useful.

She s beginning to look quite **raddled**.

scraggy Being very thin. Scraggy cliffs.

Inferior in size or quality.

scrawny Scrawny cattle.

**shrivelled** age.

A handful of **shrivelled** leaves.

**skeletal** Of or relating to or forming or attached to a skeleton.
