Definitions of "Gauntlet" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "gauntlet" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A form of punishment in which a person is forced to run between two lines of men facing each other and armed with clubs or whips to beat the victim.
- A glove of armored leather; protects the hand.
- A strong glove with a long, loose wrist.
- A glove with long sleeve.
- To offer or accept a challenge.
- The part of a glove covering the wrist.
- An armoured glove.

Synonyms of "Gauntlet" as a noun (2 Words)

gantlet A glove with long sleeve.

A mixture containing two or more metallic elements or metallic and **metal glove** nonmetallic elements usually fused together or dissolving into each other when molten.
