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Associations of "Gave" (30 Words)

allocate	Distribute (resources or duties) for a particular purpose. <i>Students are allocated accommodation on a yearly basis.</i>
allot	Give or apportion (something) to someone. <i>I was allotted a little room in the servants block.</i>
amortization	Payment of an obligation in a series of installments or transfers. <i>An amortization schedule shows your payments each month and how it affects the total amount you owe.</i>
apportion	Divide up and share out. <i>They did not apportion blame or liability to any one individual.</i>
appropriation	Money set aside (as by a legislature) for a specific purpose. <i>A person s appropriation of property belonging to another is dishonest.</i>
assign	Give an assignment to a person to a post or assign a task to a person. <i>She has been assigned to a new job.</i>
authorization	The act of conferring legality or sanction or formal warrant. <i>The raising of revenue and the authorization of spending.</i>
bestow	Bestow a quality on. <i>The office was bestowed on him by the monarch of this realm.</i>
cede	Give over; surrender or relinquish to the physical control of another. <i>In 1874 the islands were ceded to Britain.</i>
compensate	Make payment to compensate. <i>The manager is hoping for victory to compensate for the team s dismal league campaign.</i>
compensation	The action or process of awarding compensation. <i>The compensation of victims.</i>
concession	A piece of land into which surveyed land is divided. <i>There are concessions on party bookings.</i>

copyright	Protected by copyright. <i>Making an unauthorized copy would infringe copyright.</i>
dispense	Give or apply (medications). <i>The machines dispense a range of drinks.</i>
distribute	Cause to be distributed. <i>Information leaflets are being distributed to hotels.</i>
<u>forgo</u>	Be earlier in time; go back further. <i>She wanted to forgo the tea and leave while they could.</i>
generously	In a way that shows a readiness to give more of something, especially money, than is necessary or expected. <i>Everyone is asked to give generously to this worthy cause.</i>
grant	The action of granting something. <i>This bill grants us new rights.</i>
gratuity	A relatively small amount of money given for services rendered (as by a waiter). <i>An end of contract gratuity of 20 of the total pay received.</i>
<u>impart</u>	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. <i>Impart a new skill to the students.</i>
meed	A fitting reward. <i>He must extract from her some meed of approbation.</i>
quota	(in the Anglican Church) the proportion of the funds of a parish contributed to the finances of the diocese. <i>All the salesmen met their quota for the month.</i>
reassign	Appoint (someone) to a different post or role. <i>He had been reassigned to another post.</i>
remunerate	Make payment to; compensate. <i>My efforts were not remunerated.</i>
remuneration	Something that remunerates. <i>They work in excess of their contracted hours for no additional remuneration.</i>
<u>salary</u>	Pay a salary to. <i>A 15 per cent salary increase.</i>
<u>submit</u>	Present (a proposal, application, or other document) to a person or body for consideration or judgement. <i>Samples submitted to low pressure while being airfreighted.</i>
unremunerative	Bringing little or no profit or income. <i>An unremunerative occupation.</i>

The result or effect of doing something considered wrong or unwise.
*Napoleon and Hitler **waged** war against all of Europe.*

yield

Production of a certain amount.
*He reeled into the house as the door **yielded**.*
