## Associations of "Gave" (30 Words)

<b>allocate</b>	Distribute (resources or duties) for a particular purpose. <i>Students are <b>allocated</b> accommodation on a yearly basis.</i>
<b>allot</b>	Give or apportion (something) to someone. <i>I was <b>allotted</b> a little room in the servants block.</i>
<b>amortization</b>	Payment of an obligation in a series of installments or transfers. <i>An <b>amortization</b> schedule shows your payments each month and how it affects the total amount you owe.</i>
<a href="#">apportion</a>	Divide up and share out. <i>They did not <b>apportion</b> blame or liability to any one individual.</i>
<b>appropriation</b>	Money set aside (as by a legislature) for a specific purpose. <i>A person s <b>appropriation</b> of property belonging to another is dishonest.</i>
<b>assign</b>	Give an assignment to a person to a post or assign a task to a person. <i>She has been <b>assigned</b> to a new job.</i>
<b>authorization</b>	The act of conferring legality or sanction or formal warrant. <i>The raising of revenue and the <b>authorization</b> of spending.</i>
<b>bestow</b>	Bestow a quality on. <i>The office was <b>bestowed</b> on him by the monarch of this realm.</i>
<b>cede</b>	Give over; surrender or relinquish to the physical control of another. <i>In 1874 the islands were <b>ceded</b> to Britain.</i>
<a href="#">compensate</a>	Make payment to compensate. <i>The manager is hoping for victory to <b>compensate</b> for the team s dismal league campaign.</i>
<b>compensation</b>	The action or process of awarding compensation. <i>The <b>compensation</b> of victims.</i>
<b>concession</b>	A piece of land into which surveyed land is divided. <i>There are <b>concessions</b> on party bookings.</i>

<b>copyright</b>	Protected by copyright. <i>Making an unauthorized copy would infringe <b>copyright</b>.</i>
<b>dispense</b>	Give or apply (medications). <i>The machines <b>dispense</b> a range of drinks.</i>
<b>distribute</b>	Cause to be distributed. <i>Information leaflets are being <b>distributed</b> to hotels.</i>
<b>forgo</b>	Be earlier in time; go back further. <i>She wanted to <b>forgo</b> the tea and leave while they could.</i>
<b>generously</b>	In a way that shows a readiness to give more of something, especially money, than is necessary or expected. <i>Everyone is asked to give <b>generously</b> to this worthy cause.</i>
<b>grant</b>	The action of granting something. <i>This bill <b>grants</b> us new rights.</i>
<b>gratuity</b>	A relatively small amount of money given for services rendered (as by a waiter). <i>An end of contract <b>gratuity</b> of 20 of the total pay received.</i>
<b>impart</b>	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission. <i><b>Impart</b> a new skill to the students.</i>
<b>meed</b>	A fitting reward. <i>He must extract from her some <b>meed</b> of approbation.</i>
<b>quota</b>	(in the Anglican Church) the proportion of the funds of a parish contributed to the finances of the diocese. <i>All the salesmen met their <b>quota</b> for the month.</i>
<b>reassign</b>	Appoint (someone) to a different post or role. <i>He had been <b>reassigned</b> to another post.</i>
<b>remunerate</b>	Make payment to; compensate. <i>My efforts were not <b>remunerated</b>.</i>
<b>remuneration</b>	Something that remunerates. <i>They work in excess of their contracted hours for no additional <b>remuneration</b>.</i>
<b>salary</b>	Pay a salary to. <i>A 15 per cent <b>salary</b> increase.</i>
<b>submit</b>	Present (a proposal, application, or other document) to a person or body for consideration or judgement. <i>Samples <b>submitted</b> to low pressure while being airfreighted.</i>
<b>unremunerative</b>	Bringing little or no profit or income. <i>An <b>unremunerative</b> occupation.</i>

The result or effect of doing something considered wrong or unwise.  
*Napoleon and Hitler **waged** war against all of Europe.*

**yield**

Production of a certain amount.  
*He reeled into the house as the door **yielded**.*
