### Synonyms of "Gawk" as a noun (8 Words)

<b>clod</b>	An awkward stupid person. <i>You re an insensitive <b>clod</b> and I hope you fall and break your neck.</i>
<b>goon</b>	A violent, aggressive person who is hired to intimidate or harm people. <i>He hired <b>goons</b> to hunt down supporters.</i>
<b>lout</b>	An awkward stupid person. <i>Drunken <b>louts</b>.</i>

<b>lubber</b>	A big, clumsy person.
<b>lummoX</b>	An awkward stupid person. <i>Watch it you great <b>lummoX</b>.</i>
<b>lump</b>	The state of being self-employed and paid without deduction of tax, especially in the building industry. <i>Working Only on the <b>lump</b> here and there.</i>
<b>oaf</b>	An awkward stupid person. <i>They are just big clumsy <b>oafs</b>.</i>
<b>stumblebum</b>	A clumsy or inept person.

## Gawk as a Verb

### Definitions of "Gawk" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "gawk" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Stare openly and stupidly.*
- *Look with amazement; look stupidly.*

### Synonyms of "Gawk" as a verb (11 Words)

<b>gape</b>	Look with amazement; look stupidly. <i>A large duffel bag <b>gaped</b> open by her feet.</i>
<b>gawp</b>	Stare openly in a stupid or rude manner. <i>What are you <b>gawping</b> at.</i>
<b>gaze</b>	Look at with fixed eyes. <i>He could only <b>gaze</b> at her in astonishment.</i>
<b>goggle</b>	Look with wide open eyes, typically in amazement. <i>I <b>goggled</b> at them in total disbelief.</i>
<b>look fixedly</b>	Look forward to the probable occurrence of.
<b>look vacantly</b>	Accord in appearance with.
<b>ogle</b>	Stare at in a lecherous manner. <i>He was <b>ogling</b> her breasts.</i>

<b>stare</b>	Look fixedly or vacantly at someone or something with one's eyes wide open. <i>He <b>stared</b> at her in amazement.</i>
<b>stare in wonder</b>	Fixate one's eyes.
<b>stare open-mouthed</b>	Fixate one's eyes.
<b>stare stupidly</b>	Look at with fixed eyes.

## Usage Examples of "Gawk" as a verb

- *They were gawking at some pin-up.*

## Associations of "Gawk" (30 Words)

<b>cough</b>	A condition of the respiratory organs causing coughing. <i>He <b>coughed</b> up bloodstained fluid.</i>
<b>dazzle</b>	Amaze or overwhelm (someone) with a particular impressive quality. <i>The dancer <b>dazzled</b> the audience with his turns and jumps.</i>
<b>drowse</b>	Sleep lightly or for a short period of time. <i>Let not your prudence <b>drowse</b>.</i>
<b>filament</b>	A threadlike structure (as a chainlike series of cells). <i>Each myosin <b>filament</b> is usually surrounded by 12 actin <b>filaments</b>.</i>
<b>flame</b>	A thing compared to a flame's ability to burn fiercely or be extinguished. <i>Jess's cheeks <b>flamed</b>.</i>
<b>flare</b>	Become flared and widen usually at one end. <i>The skirt had a wide <b>flare</b>.</i>
<b>flash</b>	A newsflash. <i>The <b>flashings</b> of pain were a warning.</i>
<b>frown</b>	Furrow one's brows in an expression indicating disapproval, displeasure, or concentration. <i>A <b>frown</b> of disapproval.</i>
<b>gape</b>	A disease of birds with gaping of the mouth as a symptom caused by infestation with gapeworm. <i>She climbed into her sports car to the <b>gapes</b> of passers by.</i>
<b>gaze</b>	A long fixed look. <i>The male <b>gaze</b>.</i>
<b>glance</b>	Throw a glance at take a brief look at. <i>Sunlight <b>glanced</b> off the curved body of a dolphin.</i>

<b>glare</b>	Be sharply reflected. <i>The pomp and <b>glare</b> of rhetoric.</i>
<b>glass</b>	The contents of a glass. <i>Every hour the ship's <b>glass</b> was turned.</i>
<b>gleam</b>	An expression of an emotion or quality in a person's eyes. <i>The <b>gleam</b> of hope vanished.</i>
<b>glower</b>	Look at with a fixed gaze. <i>She <b>glowered</b> at him suspiciously.</i>
<b>goggle</b>	Look with wide open eyes, typically in amazement. <i>Their <b>goggle</b> mesmerizes even fishmongers.</i>
<b>limelight</b>	A focus of public attention. <i>The shock win has thrust him into the <b>limelight</b>.</i>
<b>look</b>	An expression of a feeling or thought by looking. <i>Her father <b>looked</b> unhappy.</i>
<b>lurid</b>	Presented in vividly shocking or sensational terms. <i><b>Lurid</b> food colourings.</i>
<b>ogle</b>	Look at with amorous intentions. <i>A vaguely erotic <b>ogle</b>.</i>
<b>rummage</b>	Search haphazardly. <i>He <b>rummaged</b> in his pocket for a handkerchief.</i>
<b>runny</b>	(of a person's nose) producing or discharging mucus. <i>The souffl was hard on top and quite <b>runny</b> underneath.</i>
<b>search</b>	Search or seek. <i>They are <b>searching</b> for the missing man in the entire county.</i>
<b>sneeze</b>	An act or the sound of sneezing. <i>He stopped a sudden <b>sneeze</b>.</i>
<b>spotlight</b>	Illuminate with a spotlight as in the theater. <i>The knife flashed in the <b>spotlight</b>.</i>
<b>stare</b>	Fixate one's eyes. <i>He <b>stared</b> at her in amazement.</i>
<b>staring</b>	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>Stark <b>staring</b> mad.</i>
<b>sunglasses</b>	Glasses tinted to protect the eyes from sunlight or glare.
<b>wear</b>	Have in one's aspect wear an expression of one's attitude or personality. <i>He always <b>wears</b> a smile.</i>
<b>yawn</b>	Utter a yawn as from lack of oxygen or when one is tired. <i>The <b>yawning</b> in the audience told him it was time to stop.</i>
