- He fixed his paternal gaze on me.






Gaze as a Verb

Definitions of "Gaze" as a verb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "gaze" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Look at with fixed eyes.
- Look steadily and intently, especially in admiration, surprise, or thought.





Synonyms of "Gaze" as a verb (9 Words)

gape Look with amazement; look stupidly.

A large duffel bag gaped open by her feet.

goggle (of the eyes) open wide or protrude.

I **goggle**d at them in total disbelief.

Look or gaze in a lascivious or unpleasant way. Bystanders were **leer**ing at the nude painting.

Look forward to the probable occurrence of.

She looked over the expanse of land.

look fixedly Convey by one's expression.

leer

look vacantly Look forward to the probable occurrence of.

Look with difficulty or concentration at someone or something.

Faye **peer**ed at her with suspicion.

Be unpleasantly prominent or striking.

A contemptuous or mocking smile, remark, or tone. sneer

stare He **stare**d at her in amazement.

Staring eyes.

Thrown into a state of intense fear or desperation. terrified

The **terrified** horse bolted.

Cause to feel extreme fear. terrify

The thought terrifies me.



terror Terrorism.

She had a terror of darkness.

tincture A quality of a given color that differs slightly from another color.

The sky was **tincture**d red.

unadulterated (especially of food or drink) having no inferior added substances; pure.

Pure **unadulterated** jealousy.

Not diminished or moderated in intensity or severity; sometimes used as

unmitigated an intensifier.

An **unmitigated** lie.

utter Express audibly utter sounds not necessarily words.

He **utter**ed strange sounds that nobody could understand.

yawn

Utter a yawn as from lack of oxygen or when one is tired.

The yawning in the audience told him it was time to stop.
