
Definitions of "Gear" as a noun

- A toothed wheel that works with others to alter the relation between the speed of a driving mechanism (such as the engine of a vehicle) and the speed of the driven parts (the wheels.
- Illegal drugs.
- Clothing, especially of a specified kind.
- A mechanism for transmitting motion for some specific purpose (as the steering gear of a vehicle.



- Personal possessions and clothes.
- Equipment consisting of miscellaneous articles needed for a particular operation or sport etc.
- A toothed wheel that engages another toothed mechanism in order to change the speed or direction of transmitted motion.
- A particular setting of engaged gears.
- Wheelwork consisting of a connected set of rotating gears by which force is transmitted or motion or torque is changed.
- Used in reference to the level of effort or intensity expended in an activity or undertaking.

<u>garments</u>	An article of clothing. <i>Garments</i> of the finest silk.
gear mechanism	Wheelwork consisting of a connected set of rotating gears by which force is transmitted or motion or torque is changed.
gear ratio	Equipment consisting of miscellaneous articles needed for a particular operation or sport etc.
gear wheel	A mechanism for transmitting motion for some specific purpose (as the steering gear of a vehicle.

odds and ends	The ratio by which one better's wager is greater than that of another.



<u>paraphernalia</u>	Equipment consisting of miscellaneous articles needed for a particular operation or sport etc. Drills saws and other paraphernalia necessary for home improvements.
personal effects	A short newspaper article about a particular person or group.
possessions	The trait of resolutely controlling your own behavior. They took possession of the ball on their own goal line.
power train	The rate of doing work; measured in watts (= joules/second.
property	Shares or investments in property. The stolen property was not recovered.
<u>speed</u>	Something that matches one's tastes or inclinations. An engine running at full speed .
stimulant	Something that increases activity, interest, or enthusiasm in a specified field. It is a stimulant that has a direct effect on the nervous system.
substance	Wealth and possessions. He had yet to accomplish anything of substance .
<u>train</u>	A series of connected events or thoughts. They joined the wagon train for safety.
trappings	A horse's ornamental harness. I had the trappings of success.



- Design or adjust the gears in a machine to give a specified speed or power output.




