- *An apparatus for producing gas, steam, or another substance.*
- *An electronic device for producing a signal voltage.*
- *Engine that converts mechanical energy into electrical energy by electromagnetic induction.*
- *A person or thing that generates something.*
- *A point, line, or surface regarded as moving and so notionally forming a line, surface, or solid.*
- *Someone who originates or causes or initiates something.*
- *An apparatus that produces a vapor or gas.*

<b>basis</b>	The justification for or reasoning behind something. <i>The <b>basis</b> of this drink is orange juice.</i>
<b>beginning</b>	The event consisting of the start of something. <i>He left at the <b>beginning</b> of February.</i>
<b>cause</b>	Any entity that produces an effect or is responsible for events or results. <i>Forty five <b>causes</b> were entered in the list for the March session.</i>
<b>composer</b>	Someone who composes music as a profession. <i>Mozart was her favourite <b>composer</b>.</i>
<b>designer</b>	Someone who creates plans to be used in making something (such as buildings). <i>He is believed to be the principal <b>designer</b> of the terrorist bombing attack.</i>

<b>developer</b>	Photographic equipment consisting of a chemical solution for developing film. <i>Software <b>developers</b>.</i>
<b>deviser</b>	A person who makes plans.
<b>driving force</b>	The act of controlling and steering the movement of a vehicle or animal.
<b>fount</b>	A spring or fountain. <i>Our courier was a <b>fount</b> of knowledge.</i>
<b>fountain</b>	A natural spring of water. <i>Little <b>fountains</b> of dust.</i>
<a href="#"><u>impetus</u></a>	Something that makes a process or activity happen or happen more quickly. <i>The ending of the Cold War gave new <b>impetus</b> to idealism.</i>
<a href="#"><u>impulse</u></a>	A change of momentum produced by an impulse equivalent to the average value of the force multiplied by the time during which it acts. <i>He bought it on an <b>impulse</b>.</i>
<b>incentive</b>	A positive motivational influence. <i>Give farmers an <b>incentive</b> to improve their land.</i>
<a href="#"><u>inventor</u></a>	Someone who is the first to think of or make something.
<b>maker</b>	A business engaged in manufacturing some product. <i>A cabinet<b>maker</b>.</i>
<b>motivation</b>	A set of facts and arguments used in support of a proposal. <i>Escape can be a strong <b>motivation</b> for travel.</i>
<a href="#"><u>motive</u></a>	A theme that is repeated or elaborated in a piece of music. <i>He acted with the best of <b>motives</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>origin</u></a>	Properties attributable to your ancestry. <i>Jupiter was the <b>origin</b> of the radiation.</i>
<b>prime mover</b>	The period of greatest prosperity or productivity.
<b>producer</b>	A person or thing that makes or causes something. <i>A record <b>producer</b>.</i>
<b>reason</b>	A justification for something existing or happening. <i>Giles is the <b>reason</b> that I am here.</i>
<a href="#"><u>root</u></a>	Any plant grown for its root. <i>In the sequence the <b>roots</b> of the chords drop by fifths.</i>
<b>source</b>	The place where something begins, where it springs into being. <i>Military <b>sources</b> announced a reduction in strategic nuclear weapons.</i>
<a href="#"><u>writer</u></a>	A person who has written something or who writes in a particular way. <i>A CD <b>writer</b>.</i>

## Associations of "Generator" (30 Words)

<b>adapter</b>	A musician who adapts a composition for particular voices or instruments or for another style of performance. <i>The <b>adapter</b> converts the lens focal length to 55 mm.</i>
<b>antifreeze</b>	A liquid, typically one based on ethylene glycol, that can be added to water to lower the freezing point, chiefly used in the radiator of a motor vehicle. <i>Formulating <b>antifreezes</b> and deicers for railways is no easy job.</i>
<b>battery</b>	A series of small cages for the intensive rearing of farm animals, especially calves and poultry. <i>Children are given a <b>battery</b> of tests.</i>
<b>charger</b>	Formerly a strong swift horse ridden into battle.
<b>dam</b>	Obstruct with or as if with a dam. <i>Discussion was in full flow and refused to be <b>dammed</b>.</i>

<b>detroit</b>	The largest city in Michigan and a major Great Lakes port; center of the United States automobile industry; located in southeastern Michigan on the Detroit river across from Windsor.
<b>diesel</b>	A heavy petroleum fraction used as fuel in diesel engines. <i>A <b>diesel</b> locomotive.</i>
<b>dynamo</b>	A machine for converting mechanical energy into electrical energy, typically by means of rotating coils of copper wire in a magnetic field. <i>She was a <b>dynamo</b> in London politics.</i>
<b>electric</b>	The system of electric wiring and parts in a house or vehicle. <i>Gave an <b>electric</b> reading of the play.</i>
<b>electricity</b>	The supply of electric current to a building for heating, lighting, or powering appliances. <i>The atmosphere was charged with a dangerous sexual <b>electricity</b>.</i>
<b>electrolyte</b>	The ionized or ionizable constituents of a living cell, blood, or other organic matter. <i>The proper amount and distribution of <b>electrolytes</b> in the body is essential for health.</i>
<u><b>engine</b></u>	A fire engine. <i>The roar of a car <b>engine</b>.</i>
<b>galvanic</b>	Affected by emotion as if by electricity; thrilling. <i>A searing <b>galvanic</b> experience.</i>
<u><b>heat</b></u>	The amount of heat that is needed to cause a specific process or is evolved in such a process. <i>Chilli peppers add taste and <b>heat</b> to food.</i>
<b>hydroelectric</b>	Relating to or denoting the generation of electricity using flowing water (typically from a reservoir held behind a dam or barrage) to drive a turbine which powers a generator. <i>Economic and environmental aspect of the <b>hydroelectric</b> scheme.</i>
<b>kilowatt</b>	A measure of one thousand watts of electrical power.
<b>locomotive</b>	Of or relating to locomotion. <i>A diesel <b>locomotive</b>.</i>
<b>motor</b>	Driven by a motor. <i>The sander has a smooth and powerful 520 watt <b>motor</b>.</i>
<b>oil</b>	Oil paint. <i>400 birds were coated with <b>oil</b> which spilled out from an opened valve.</i>
<u><b>powerhouse</b></u>	An electrical generating station. <i>Germany s economic <b>powerhouse</b>.</i>

<b>propulsion</b>	The act of propelling. <i>They dive and use their wings for <b>propulsion</b> under water.</i>
<b>recharge</b>	(of a person) return to a normal state of mind or strength after a period of exertion. <i>The rate at which the aquifer <b>recharges</b> naturally.</i>
<b>reservoir</b>	A large or extra supply of something. <i>An infectious agent depends on a <b>reservoir</b> for its survival.</i>
<b>ride</b>	A mechanical device that you ride for amusement or excitement. <i>He <b>rides</b> the subway downtown every day.</i>
<b>steam</b>	Travel by means of steam power. <i>He <b>steamed</b> his shirts to remove the odour.</i>
<b>streetcar</b>	A wheeled vehicle that runs on rails and is propelled by electricity.
<b>thermoelectric</b>	Involving or resulting from thermoelectricity.
<b>turbine</b>	A machine for producing continuous power in which a wheel or rotor, typically fitted with vanes, is made to revolve by a fast-moving flow of water, steam, gas, air, or other fluid.
<b>vaporizer</b>	A device that generates a particular substance in the form of vapour, especially for medicinal inhalation.
<b>watt</b>	The SI unit of power, equivalent to one joule per second, corresponding to the rate of consumption of energy in an electric circuit where the potential difference is one volt and the current one ampere.
