## Synonyms of "Genuine" as an adjective (22 Words)

<u>actual</u>	Existing now; current. Using <b>actual</b> income to measure expected income.
<u>authentic</u>	(in existentialist philosophy) relating to or denoting an emotionally appropriate, significant, purposive, and responsible mode of human life. <i>The letter is now accepted as an <b>authentic</b> document.</i>
bona fide	Undertaken in good faith.
<u>candid</u>	Openly straightforward and direct without reserve or secretiveness. A <b>candid</b> photograph.
direct	Of a current flowing in one direction only. Ferns like a bright position out of <b>direct</b> sunlight.
echt	Authentic and typical. Bart was an <b>echt</b> baseball fan.



frank	Open, sincere, or undisguised. To be perfectly <b>frank</b> I don t know.	
<u>honest</u>	Worthy of being depended on. I did the only right and <b>honest</b> thing.	
literal	Free from exaggeration or distortion. A <b>literal</b> translation.	
meaning what one says Rich in significance or implication.		
open	Of a vowel produced with a relatively wide opening of the mouth and the tongue kept low. <i>The clarity and resonance of an</i> <b>open</b> <i>tone</i> .	
<u>original</u>	Preceding all others in time or being as first made or performed. <i>Restored the house to its <b>original</b> condition.</i>	
real	Coinciding with reality. It s time he had a <b>real</b> job.	
<u>sincere</u>	Free from pretence or deceit; proceeding from genuine feelings. An entirely <b>sincere</b> and cruel tyrant.	
<u>straightforward</u>	Pointed directly ahead. A <b>straightforward</b> young man.	
true	Of a compass bearing measured relative to true north. A <b>true</b> story.	
truthful	(of artistic or literary representation) characterized by accuracy or realism; true to life. <i>I want a <b>truthful</b> answer.</i>	
<u>unadulterated</u>	(especially of food or drink) having no inferior added substances; pure. <b>Unadulterated</b> whole milk yogurt.	
unalloyed	Free from admixture. <b>Unalloyed</b> delight.	
unfeigned	Not pretended; sincerely felt or expressed. <i>Her interest in people was <b>unfeigned</b>.</i>	
unhypocritical	Free from pretence; sincere. An <b>unhypocritical</b> and honest person.	
<u>veritable</u>	Not counterfeit or copied. <i>He s a <b>veritable</b> swine.</i>

accuracy	(mathematics) the number of significant figures given in a number. We have confidence in the <b>accuracy</b> of the statistics.
<u>actual</u>	Being or reflecting the essential or genuine character of something- G.K.Chesterton. <i>Her actual motive</i> .
artless	Without effort or pretentiousness; natural and simple. <i>Artless</i> sincerity.
<u>authentic</u>	Conforming to fact and therefore worthy of belief. Every detail of the film was totally <b>authentic</b> .
authenticity	The quality of being authentic. The paper should have established the <b>authenticity</b> of the documents before publishing them.



<u>candid</u>	Informal or natural; especially caught off guard or unprepared. His <b>candid</b> eyes.
<u>candor</u>	The quality of being honest and straightforward in attitude and speech.
fact	An event known to have happened or something known to have existed. <i>He supported his argument with an impressive array of</i> <b>fact</b> s.
factual	Of or relating to or characterized by facts. <i>Cases mentioned are <b>factual</b>.</i>
frank	Open, sincere, or undisguised. To be perfectly <b>frank</b> I don t know.
guileless	Free of deceit. His face once so open and <b>guileless</b> .
<u>honest</u>	Without pretensions. My <b>honest</b> opinion.
<u>honesty</u>	Southeastern European plant cultivated for its fragrant purplish flowers and round flat papery silver-white seedpods that are used for indoor decoration. <i>I bought potatoes and tomatoes from the roadside stall putting 3 in the honesty</i> box.
integrity	Internal consistency or lack of corruption in electronic data. Upholding territorial <b>integrity</b> and national sovereignty.
legitimacy	Lawfulness by virtue of being authorized or in accordance with law. It is difficult to judge the <b>legitimacy</b> of the rumour.
<u>openness</u>	Lack of restriction; accessibility. Total <b>openness</b> to all points of view.
<u>pure</u>	Of color being chromatically pure not diluted with white or grey or black. The romantic notion of <b>pure</b> art devoid of social responsibility.
real	Coinciding with reality F A Olafson. An increase in <b>real</b> terms of 11 6 per cent.
reality	Relating to reality TV. Laura was losing touch with <b>reality</b> .
reliable	A reliable person or thing. <b>Reliable</b> information.
<u>sincere</u>	Free from pretence or deceit; proceeding from genuine feelings. <i>Sincere friendship</i> .
<u>sincerity</u>	The quality of being open and truthful; not deceitful or hypocritical. <i>His <b>sincerity</b> inspired belief.</i>
sooth	Truth or reality. In <b>sooth</b> .



transparency	The condition of being transparent. The <b>transparency</b> of ice.
truth	A true statement. <i>He was famous for the <b>truth</b> of his portraits.</i>
truthful	Telling or expressing the truth; honest. I want a <b>truthful</b> answer.
<u>truthfulness</u>	The fact of being realistic or true to life; realism. The <b>truthfulness</b> of her playing of an ageing American spinster.
veracious	Speaking or representing the truth. A <b>veracious</b> account.
<u>veracity</u>	Unwillingness to tell lies. Voters should be concerned about his <b>veracity</b> and character.
<u>veritable</u>	Used for emphasis, often to qualify a metaphor. <i>He s a <b>veritable</b> swine</i> .
