| acquire | Gain knowledge or skills. <i>Children acquire language at an amazing rate.</i> |
| acquirement | An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>The acquirement of self control.</i> |
| acquisition | Something acquired. <i>Western culture places a high value on material acquisition.</i> |
| arrival | Accomplishment of an objective. <i>They awaited her arrival.</i> |
| arrive | Reach a destination arrive by movement or progress. <i>We will be in touch with them when the time arrives.</i> |
| attain | Succeed in achieving (something that one has worked for). <i>He attained the rank of Brigadier.</i> |
| attainable | Able to be attained; achievable. <i>Yields in excess of 6 are easily attainable.</i> |
| available | Able to be used or obtained; at someone’s disposal. <i>The larger the pool of available singles the greater your chance of finding someone special.</i> |
| bring | Go or come after and bring or take back. <i>Could you bring the wine.</i> |
| broach | Raise (a difficult subject) for discussion. <i>The salmon broach then fall to slap the water.</i> |
| come | Come from be connected by a relationship of blood for example. <i>The letter hasn t come yet.</i> |
| conformism | Orthodoxy in thoughts and belief. |

| derive | Obtain. <i>Words whose spelling derives from Dr Johnson s incorrect etymology.</i> |
| <u>earn</u> | Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>I earned 10 an hour working in the shop.</i> |
| <u>ensue</u> | Issue or terminate (in a specified way, state, etc.); end. <i>The difficulties which ensued from their commitment to Cuba.</i> |
| expulsion | The action of forcing something out of the body. <i>The expulsion of two diplomats from the embassy.</i> |
| fetch | The action of fetching. <i>The old print fetched a high price at the auction.</i> |
| gain | Increase (one's body weight). <i>The home team was gaining ground.</i> |
| have | Have as a feature. <i>I don t have any money left.</i> |
| obtain | Get, acquire, or secure (something). <i>Adequate insurance cover is difficult to obtain.</i> |
| possession | The act of controlling the ball (or puck). <i>The book came into my possession.</i> |
| procure | Arrange for sexual partners for others. <i>He haunted railway stations to procure young girls for immoral purposes.</i> |
| <u>procurement</u> | The action of obtaining or procuring something. <i>The company s procurements from foreign firms.</i> |
| purchase | Obtain by purchase acquire by means of a financial transaction. <i>The victory was purchased by the death of Rhiwallon.</i> |
| reach | Reach a point in time or a certain state or level. <i>I ve been trying to reach you all morning.</i> |
| <u>regain</u> | Reach (a place, position, or thing) again; get back to. <i>She regained control of herself.</i> |
| retrieval | The cognitive operation of accessing information in memory. <i>Online information retrieval.</i> |
| succeed | Attain success or reach a desired goal. <i>It was a mission that could not possibly succeed.</i> |
| <u>triumph</u> | A successful ending of a struggle or contest. <i>They had no chance of triumphing over the Nationalists.</i> |
