<b>acquirement</b>	The cognitive process of acquiring skill or knowledge. <i>The <b>acquisition</b> of one company by another.</i>
<b>arrive</b>	Reach a destination arrive by movement or progress. <i>They <b>arrived</b> at the same conclusion.</i>
<a href="#">attain</a>	To gain with effort. <i>Clarify your objectives and ways of <b>attaining</b> them.</i>
<a href="#">attainable</a>	Capable of being attained or accomplished. <i>Yields in excess of 6 are easily <b>attainable</b>.</i>
<b>available</b>	(of a person) not otherwise occupied; free to do something. <i>He was <b>available</b> and willing to accompany her.</i>
<b>bring</b>	Bring into a different state. <i>She <b>brings</b> a special atmosphere to our meetings.</i>
<b>come</b>	Come to pass arrive as in due course. <i>I make sure my kids <b>come</b> first.</i>
<b>derive</b>	(of a sentence in a natural language) be linked by a set of stages to (its underlying logical form). <i>Words whose spelling <b>derives</b> from Dr Johnson s incorrect etymology.</i>
<a href="#">earn</a>	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>This latest win <b>earned</b> them 50 000 in prize money.</i>

<b>expulsion</b>	The action or process of forcing someone to leave a place. <i>Oxytocin causes <b>expulsion</b> of milk from the lactating mammary gland.</i>
<b>fetch</b>	The action of fetching. <i>That brute Cullam <b>fetch</b>ed him a wallop.</i>
<b>gain</b>	Benefit. <i>The stock market <b>gained</b> 24 points today.</i>
<b>have</b>	Have sex with archaic use. <i><b>Have</b> a lover.</i>
<b><u>incur</u></b>	Receive a specified treatment (abstract). <i>I will pay any expenses <b>incurred</b>.</i>
<b>obtain</b>	Be prevalent, customary, or established. <i>Adequate insurance cover is difficult to <b>obtain</b>.</i>
<b>obtainable</b>	Capable of being obtained. <i>Customers financial details are easily <b>obtainable</b>.</i>
<b>possession</b>	The act of having and controlling property. <i>They re charged with <b>possession</b>.</i>
<b>procure</b>	Get by special effort. <i>Food <b>procured</b> for the rebels.</i>
<b><u>procurement</u></b>	The action or occupation of acquiring military equipment and supplies. <i>The company s <b>procurements</b> from foreign firms.</i>
<b>purchase</b>	Something acquired by purchase. <i>Mr Gill spotted the manuscript at a local auction and <b>purchased</b> it for 1 500.</i>
<b>reach</b>	Reach a point in time or a certain state or level. <i>She <b>reached</b> forward and yanked the curtains back.</i>
<b>receive</b>	Receive a specified treatment abstract. <i>The band will <b>receive</b> a 100 000 advance.</i>
<b>recipient</b>	The semantic role of the animate entity that is passively involved in the happening denoted by the verb in the clause. <i>The <b>recipient</b> of the Nobel Peace Prize.</i>
<b><u>regain</u></b>	Come upon after searching; find the location of something that was missed or lost. <i>He soon <b>regained</b> his composure.</i>
<b>retrieval</b>	The operation of accessing information from the computer's memory. <i>Online information <b>retrieval</b>.</i>
<b><u>secure</u></b>	Make (a door or container) hard to open; fasten or lock. <i>No airport is totally <b>secure</b>.</i>
