acquirement	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>The acquirement of self control.</i>

come	Come to pass arrive as in due course. <i>I make sure my kids come first.</i>
derive	(of a sentence in a natural language) be linked by a set of stages to (its underlying logical form). <i>Words whose spelling derives from Dr Johnson s incorrect etymology.</i>
earn	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>This latest win earned them 50 000 in prize money.</i>

expulsion	The action or process of forcing someone to leave a place. <i>Oxytocin causes expulsion of milk from the lactating mammary gland.</i>
fetch	The action of fetching. <i>That brute Cullam fetched him a wallop.</i>
gain	Benefit. <i>The stock market gained 24 points today.</i>
have	Have sex with archaic use. <i>Have a lover.</i>
<u>incur</u>	Receive a specified treatment (abstract). <i>I will pay any expenses incurred.</i>
obtain	Be prevalent, customary, or established. <i>Adequate insurance cover is difficult to obtain.</i>
obtainable	Capable of being obtained. <i>Customers financial details are easily obtainable.</i>
possession	The act of having and controlling property. <i>They re charged with possession.</i>
procure	Get by special effort. <i>Food procured for the rebels.</i>
<u>procurement</u>	The action or occupation of acquiring military equipment and supplies. <i>The company s procurements from foreign firms.</i>
purchase	Something acquired by purchase. <i>Mr Gill spotted the manuscript at a local auction and purchased it for 1 500.</i>
reach	Reach a point in time or a certain state or level. <i>She reached forward and yanked the curtains back.</i>
receive	Receive a specified treatment abstract. <i>The band will receive a 100 000 advance.</i>
recipient	The semantic role of the animate entity that is passively involved in the happening denoted by the verb in the clause. <i>The recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize.</i>
<u>regain</u>	Come upon after searching; find the location of something that was missed or lost. <i>He soon regained his composure.</i>
retrieval	The operation of accessing information from the computer's memory. <i>Online information retrieval.</i>
<u>secure</u>	Make (a door or container) hard to open; fasten or lock. <i>No airport is totally secure.</i>

An act or an instance of obtaining something by persuasion or clever manipulation.
