Associations of "Getting" (30 Words)

acquire	Learn or develop (a skill, habit, or quality. I ve acquire d a taste for whisky.
acquired	Gotten through environmental forces. <i>Acquired</i> characteristics such as a suntan or a broken nose cannot be passed on.
acquirement	Something acquired, typically a skill. <i>The acquirement of self control.</i>
acquisition	An ability that has been acquired by training. Western culture places a high value on material acquisition .
arrive	Reach a destination arrive by movement or progress. They arrive d at the same conclusion.
<u>attain</u>	To gain with effort. Clarify your objectives and ways of attain ing them.



<u>attainable</u>	Able to be attained; achievable. An attainable target.
available	(of a person) not otherwise occupied; free to do something. <i>Community health services</i> available to Londoners.
bring	Go or come after and bring or take back. What bring s you here.
come	Come forth. I let my stupid pride come between us.
derive	Obtain. The present name derive s from an older form.
<u>earn</u>	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. This latest win earn ed them 50 000 in prize money.
expulsion	The action of forcing something out of the body. The expulsion of pus from the pimple.
fetch	The action of fetching. <i>He ran to fetch help.</i>
gain	The factor by which power or voltage is increased in an amplifier or other electronic device, usually expressed as a logarithm. <i>They recorded the cattle s gain in weight over a period of weeks.</i>
have	Have or possess either in a concrete or an abstract sense. <i>She s going to have a baby.</i>
<u>incur</u>	Become subject to (something unwelcome or unpleasant) as a result of one's own behaviour or actions. People who smoke incur a great danger to their health.
obtain	Get, acquire, or secure (something. <i>The price of silver fell to that obtaining elsewhere in the ancient world.</i>
obtainable	Able to be obtained. Customers financial details are easily obtainable .
possession	The state of being controlled by a demon or spirit. The landlord wishes to gain possession of the accommodation.
procure	Persuade or cause (someone) to do something. Food procure d for the rebels.
<u>procurement</u>	The act of getting possession of something. Financial assistance for the procurement of legal advice.
purchase	Obtain by purchase acquire by means of a financial transaction. She made her purchase s carefully.



reach	Reach a goal e g. The conference reach ed agreement on the draft treaty.
receive	Receive as a retribution or punishment. She receive d only cuts and bruises.
recipient	Receiving or capable of receiving something. A recipient country.
<u>regain</u>	Reach (a place, position, or thing) again; get back to. They were unable to regain their boats.
retrieval	The operation of accessing information from the computer's memory. The investigation was completed after the retrieval of plane wreckage.
<u>secure</u>	Make certain of. The division secure d a major contract.
wangle	Manage to obtain (something) by persuading or cleverly manipulating someone. <i>I think we should be able to wangle it so that you can start tomorrow.</i>
