acquire	Learn or develop (a skill, habit, or quality. I ve <b>acquire</b> d a taste for whisky.
acquired	Gotten through environmental forces. <i>Acquired</i> characteristics such as a suntan or a broken nose cannot be passed on.
acquirement	Something acquired, typically a skill. <i>The <b>acquirement</b> of self control.</i>
acquisition	An ability that has been acquired by training. Western culture places a high value on material <b>acquisition</b> .
arrive	Reach a destination arrive by movement or progress. They <b>arrive</b> d at the same conclusion.
<u>attain</u>	To gain with effort. Clarify your objectives and ways of <b>attain</b> ing them.



<u>attainable</u>	Able to be attained; achievable. An <b>attainable</b> target.
available	(of a person) not otherwise occupied; free to do something. <i>Community health services</i> <b>available</b> to Londoners.
bring	Go or come after and bring or take back. What <b>bring</b> s you here.
come	Come forth. I let my stupid pride <b>come</b> between us.
derive	Obtain. The present name <b>derive</b> s from an older form.
<u>earn</u>	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. This latest win <b>earn</b> ed them 50 000 in prize money.
expulsion	The action of forcing something out of the body. The <b>expulsion</b> of pus from the pimple.
fetch	The action of fetching. <i>He ran to <b>fetch</b> help.</i>
gain	The factor by which power or voltage is increased in an amplifier or other electronic device, usually expressed as a logarithm. <i>They recorded the cattle s gain in weight over a period of weeks.</i>
have	Have or possess either in a concrete or an abstract sense. <i>She s going to have a baby.</i>
<u>incur</u>	Become subject to (something unwelcome or unpleasant) as a result of one's own behaviour or actions. People who smoke <b>incur</b> a great danger to their health.
obtain	Get, acquire, or secure (something. <i>The price of silver fell to that <b>obtain</b>ing elsewhere in the ancient world.</i>
obtainable	Able to be obtained. Customers financial details are easily <b>obtainable</b> .
possession	The state of being controlled by a demon or spirit. The landlord wishes to gain <b>possession</b> of the accommodation.
procure	Persuade or cause (someone) to do something. Food <b>procure</b> d for the rebels.
<u>procurement</u>	The act of getting possession of something. Financial assistance for the <b>procurement</b> of legal advice.
purchase	Obtain by purchase acquire by means of a financial transaction. She made her <b>purchase</b> s carefully.



reach	Reach a goal e g. The conference <b>reach</b> ed agreement on the draft treaty.
receive	Receive as a retribution or punishment. She <b>receive</b> d only cuts and bruises.
recipient	Receiving or capable of receiving something. A <b>recipient</b> country.
<u>regain</u>	Reach (a place, position, or thing) again; get back to. They were unable to <b>regain</b> their boats.
retrieval	The operation of accessing information from the computer's memory. The investigation was completed after the <b>retrieval</b> of plane wreckage.
<u>secure</u>	Make certain of. The division <b>secure</b> d a major contract.
wangle	Manage to obtain (something) by persuading or cleverly manipulating someone. <i>I think we should be able to <b>wangle</b> it so that you can start tomorrow.</i>
