### **Definitions of "Getting" as a noun**

- acquire** Learn or develop (a skill, habit, or quality).  
*I ve **acquired** a taste for whisky.*
- acquired** Gotten through environmental forces.  
***Acquired** characteristics such as a suntan or a broken nose cannot be passed on.*
- acquirement** Something acquired, typically a skill.  
*The **acquirement** of self control.*
- acquisition** An ability that has been acquired by training.  
*Western culture places a high value on material **acquisition**.*
- arrive** Reach a destination arrive by movement or progress.  
*They **arrived** at the same conclusion.*
- attain** To gain with effort.  
*Clarify your objectives and ways of **attaining** them.*

<b>attainable</b>	Able to be attained; achievable. <i>An <b>attainable</b> target.</i>
<b>available</b>	(of a person) not otherwise occupied; free to do something. <i>Community health services <b>available</b> to Londoners.</i>
<b>bring</b>	Go or come after and bring or take back. <i>What <b>brings</b> you here.</i>
<b>come</b>	Come forth. <i>I let my stupid pride <b>come</b> between us.</i>
<b>derive</b>	Obtain. <i>The present name <b>derives</b> from an older form.</i>
<b>earn</b>	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>This latest win <b>earned</b> them 50 000 in prize money.</i>
<b>expulsion</b>	The action of forcing something out of the body. <i>The <b>expulsion</b> of pus from the pimple.</i>
<b>fetch</b>	The action of fetching. <i>He ran to <b>fetch</b> help.</i>
<b>gain</b>	The factor by which power or voltage is increased in an amplifier or other electronic device, usually expressed as a logarithm. <i>They recorded the cattle s <b>gain</b> in weight over a period of weeks.</i>
<b>have</b>	Have or possess either in a concrete or an abstract sense. <i>She s going to <b>have</b> a baby.</i>
<b>incur</b>	Become subject to (something unwelcome or unpleasant) as a result of one's own behaviour or actions. <i>People who smoke <b>incur</b> a great danger to their health.</i>
<b>obtain</b>	Get, acquire, or secure (something). <i>The price of silver fell to that <b>obtaining</b> elsewhere in the ancient world.</i>
<b>obtainable</b>	Able to be obtained. <i>Customers financial details are easily <b>obtainable</b>.</i>
<b>possession</b>	The state of being controlled by a demon or spirit. <i>The landlord wishes to gain <b>possession</b> of the accommodation.</i>
<b>procure</b>	Persuade or cause (someone) to do something. <i>Food <b>procured</b> for the rebels.</i>
<b>procurement</b>	The act of getting possession of something. <i>Financial assistance for the <b>procurement</b> of legal advice.</i>
<b>purchase</b>	Obtain by purchase acquire by means of a financial transaction. <i>She made her <b>purchases</b> carefully.</i>

<b>reach</b>	Reach a goal e.g. <i>The conference <b>reached</b> agreement on the draft treaty.</i>
<b>receive</b>	Receive as a retribution or punishment. <i>She <b>received</b> only cuts and bruises.</i>
<b>recipient</b>	Receiving or capable of receiving something. <i>A <b>recipient</b> country.</i>
<b><u>regain</u></b>	Reach (a place, position, or thing) again; get back to. <i>They were unable to <b>regain</b> their boats.</i>
<b>retrieval</b>	The operation of accessing information from the computer's memory. <i>The investigation was completed after the <b>retrieval</b> of plane wreckage.</i>
<b><u>secure</u></b>	Make certain of. <i>The division <b>secured</b> a major contract.</i>
<b>wangle</b>	Manage to obtain (something) by persuading or cleverly manipulating someone. <i>I think we should be able to <b>wangle</b> it so that you can start tomorrow.</i>
