Unfriendly and bad-tempered.

disagreeable

Henry was always a very disagreeable boy.

Causing displeasure or lacking pleasing qualities.

displeasing displeasing to be the centre of such a drama.

distasteful Causing dislike or aversion; disagreeable or unpleasant.

He found such cynicism distasteful.

drained Drained of electric charge discharged.

Left the lights on and came back to find the battery drained.

dreadful Extremely disagreeable and unpleasant.

This was all a **dreadful** mistake.

frightful Extreme in degree or extent or amount or impact.

A **frightful** crime of decapitation.

ghostlike Resembling or characteristic of a phantom.

Of great gravity or crucial import; requiring serious thought.

A grave God fearing man.

Of a ski run of the lowest level of difficulty as indicated by green markers

green on the run.

Are you all right You look absolutely **green**.

Used to signify the Confederate forces in the American Civil War who wore

grey grey uniforms.

His hair was **grey** and wispy.

. Causing or marked by grief or anguish.

grievous

The American fleet suffered grievous losses.

Harshly uninviting or formidable in manner or appearance.

grisly Shockingly repellent; inspiring horror.

macabre Disturbing because concerned with or causing a fear of death.

Macabre tales of war and plague in the Middle ages.

objectionable Arousing distaste or opposition; unpleasant or offensive.

I find his theory **objectionable** in its racist undertones.

obnoxious Extremely unpleasant.

He found her son somewhat **obnoxious**.

off-putting Causing annoyance or repugnance.

offensive Morally offensive.

The allegations made are deeply **offensive** to us.

Not full or rich.

She looked **pale** and drawn.

Lacking in intensity or brightness; dim or feeble.

A **pallid** sky.

pasty

Having the sticky properties of an adhesive.

He looked **pasty** and red eyed.

peakish Somewhat peaked or pointed; characterized by peaks.

Pale from illness or fatigue; sickly.

Absence of **peaky** highs and beefed up bass.

pinched Sounding as if the nose were pinched.

Her **pinched** sallow face.

sallow Unhealthy looking.

Sallow faced addicts.

sepulchral Relating to a tomb or interment.

The **sepulchral** darkness of the catacombs.

serious Appealing to the mind.

A **serious** student of history.

Severely simple.

A hefty six footer with a rather **severe** mien.

sick Having a strong distaste from surfeit.

He looked pretty **sick** at that but he eventually agreed.



Somewhat ill or prone to illness.

The walls were painted a **sickly** green.

spectral Of or like a ghost.

Spectral emanations.

terrible Causing or likely to cause terror; sinister.

I was **terrible** at basketball.

unacceptable Used of persons or their behavior.

The coach told his players that defeat was **unacceptable**.

undesirable Not wanted.

The drug s **undesirable** side effects.

unpleasant (of a person or their manner) unfriendly and inconsiderate; rude.

An **unpleasant** smell.

Ill.

unwell

Is **unwell** and can t come to work.

very bad Being the exact same one; not any other.

(of light) pale; weak.

She was looking **wan** and bleary eyed.

waxen Having the paleness of wax- Bram Stoker.

The poor face with the same awful **waxen** pallor.

waxy

Capable of being bent or flexed or twisted without breaking.

A thin face with a **waxy** paleness.

Of wine made from white grapes or dark grapes with the skins removed and

white having a yellowish colour.

A white hot center of the fire.

whitish Resembling milk in color; not clear.

monstrosity A thing, especially a building, which is very large and unsightly. *They regarded the atom bomb as a monstrosity*.

sepulchral Gruesomely indicative of death or the dead.

Hollow **sepulchral** tones.

Easily frightened; nervous.

terrible Very unwell or troubled.

unlovely Not attractive; ugly.

Unlovely tower blocks.

unsightly Unpleasant to look at.

An **unsightly** rubbish tip.
