<b><u>adolescent</u></b>	An adolescent boy or girl. <i>The books are aimed at children and <b>adolescents</b>.</i>
<b>attendant</b>	A person employed to provide a service to the public in a particular place. <i>A mosaic of the Empress Theodora with her <b>attendants</b>.</i>
<b><u>daughter</u></b>	A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source. <i>As radon gas decays it produces <b>daughters</b> that attach themselves to dust particles.</i>
<b>female child</b>	A person who belongs to the sex that can have babies.
<b>fille</b>	A young woman.
<b><u>girlfriend</u></b>	A woman's female friend. <i>Mary and her <b>girlfriend</b> organized the party.</i>
<b>lady friend</b>	A woman of the peerage in Britain.
<b>little girl</b>	A small amount or duration.

<b><u>lover</u></b>	A partner in a sexual or romantic relationship outside marriage. <i>He was a great <b>lover</b> of cats.</i>
<b><u>miss</u></b>	A young woman. <i>The penalty <b>miss</b> cost us the game.</i>
<b>missy</b>	A young woman. <i>Don t tell lies <b>missy</b> he said sternly.</i>
<b><u>partner</u></b>	A person s partner in marriage. <i>Sexual <b>partners</b>.</i>
<b>retainer</b>	A servant, especially one who has worked for a person or family for a long time. <i>Faithful family <b>retainers</b>.</i>
<b><u>sweetheart</u></b>	A very attractive or seductive looking woman. <i>Don t worry <b>sweetheart</b> I ve got it all worked out.</i>
<b><u>teenager</u></b>	A juvenile between the onset of puberty and maturity.
<b>woman</b>	A disrespectful form of address to a woman. <i>He wondered whether Billy had his <b>woman</b> with him.</i>
<b>young lady</b>	United States film and television actress (1913-2000).
<b>young person</b>	United States jazz tenor saxophonist (1909-1959).
<b>young woman</b>	Any immature animal.
<b>youngster</b>	A young person of either sex. <i>Tiddler is a British term for <b>youngster</b>.</i>

**adolescent**

Relating to or peculiar to or suggestive of an adolescent.  
*Adolescent boys and girls.*

<b><u>bachelor</u></b>	Lead a bachelor's existence. <i>One of the country's most eligible <b>bachelors</b>.</i>
<b><u>daughter</u></b>	A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source. <i>A <b>daughter</b> of the dry savannas of Africa.</i>
<b>female</b>	Relating to women or the female gender. <i>Both males and <b>females</b> accumulate economic knowledge at a similar rate.</i>
<b>feminine</b>	A feminine word or form. <i>A <b>feminine</b> voice.</i>
<b><u>feminist</u></b>	A supporter of feminism. <i><b>Feminist</b> literature.</i>
<b><u>guy</u></b>	Steady or support with a guy wire or cable. <i>A nice <b>guy</b>.</i>
<b>infantile</b>	Being or befitting or characteristic of an infant. <i><b>Infantile</b> games.</i>
<b>ingenue</b>	An artless innocent young girl (especially as portrayed on the stage).
<b><u>juvenile</u></b>	An actor playing a juvenile role. <i>Their behavior was <b>juvenile</b>.</i>
<b>kid</b>	A human offspring (son or daughter) of any age. <i>After we relaxed we just <b>kidded</b> around.</i>
<b>lass</b>	A girl or young woman who is unmarried. <i>He married a <b>lass</b> from Yorkshire.</i>
<b>maiden</b>	Being or involving the first attempt or act of its kind. <i>The liner's <b>maiden</b> voyage.</i>
<b>maidenhood</b>	The childhood of a girl. <i>Most brides wear white to symbolize <b>maidenhood</b>.</i>
<b>matriarchy</b>	A system of society or government ruled by a woman or women. <i>A <b>matriarchy</b> run by morally superior women.</i>
<b>maturation</b>	(medicine) the formation of morbid matter in an abscess or a vesicle and the discharge of pus. <i>White wines generally need less <b>maturation</b> than reds.</i>
<b>philander</b>	Have amorous affairs; of men. <i>Married men who <b>philander</b>.</i>
<b>plaything</b>	An artifact designed to be played with. <i>The rocking horse has been a favourite child's <b>plaything</b> for generations.</i>
<b>puberty</b>	The period during which adolescents reach sexual maturity and become capable of reproduction. <i>The onset of <b>puberty</b>.</i>

<b>stripling</b>	A young man. <i>He s a mere <b>stripling</b>.</i>
<b>teen</b>	A teenager. <i>The <b>teen</b> years.</i>
<b>tomboy</b>	A girl who enjoys rough, noisy activities traditionally associated with boys.
<b>widow</b>	A widowbird. <i>He was recently <b>widowed</b>.</i>
<b>widower</b>	A man whose wife is dead especially one who has not remarried. <i>Her new found passion has turned me into a tennis <b>widower</b>.</i>
<b>woman</b>	A disrespectful form of address to a woman. <i>He wondered whether Billy had his <b>woman</b> with him.</i>
<b>young</b>	Relating to or consisting of young people. <i>Many grebes carry their <b>young</b> on their backs.</i>
<b>youngster</b>	A young person of either sex. <i>Tiddler is a British term for <b>youngster</b>.</i>
<b>youth</b>	The period between childhood and adult age. <i><b>Youth</b> everywhere rises in revolt.</i>
