Synonyms of "Girl" as a noun (20 Words)

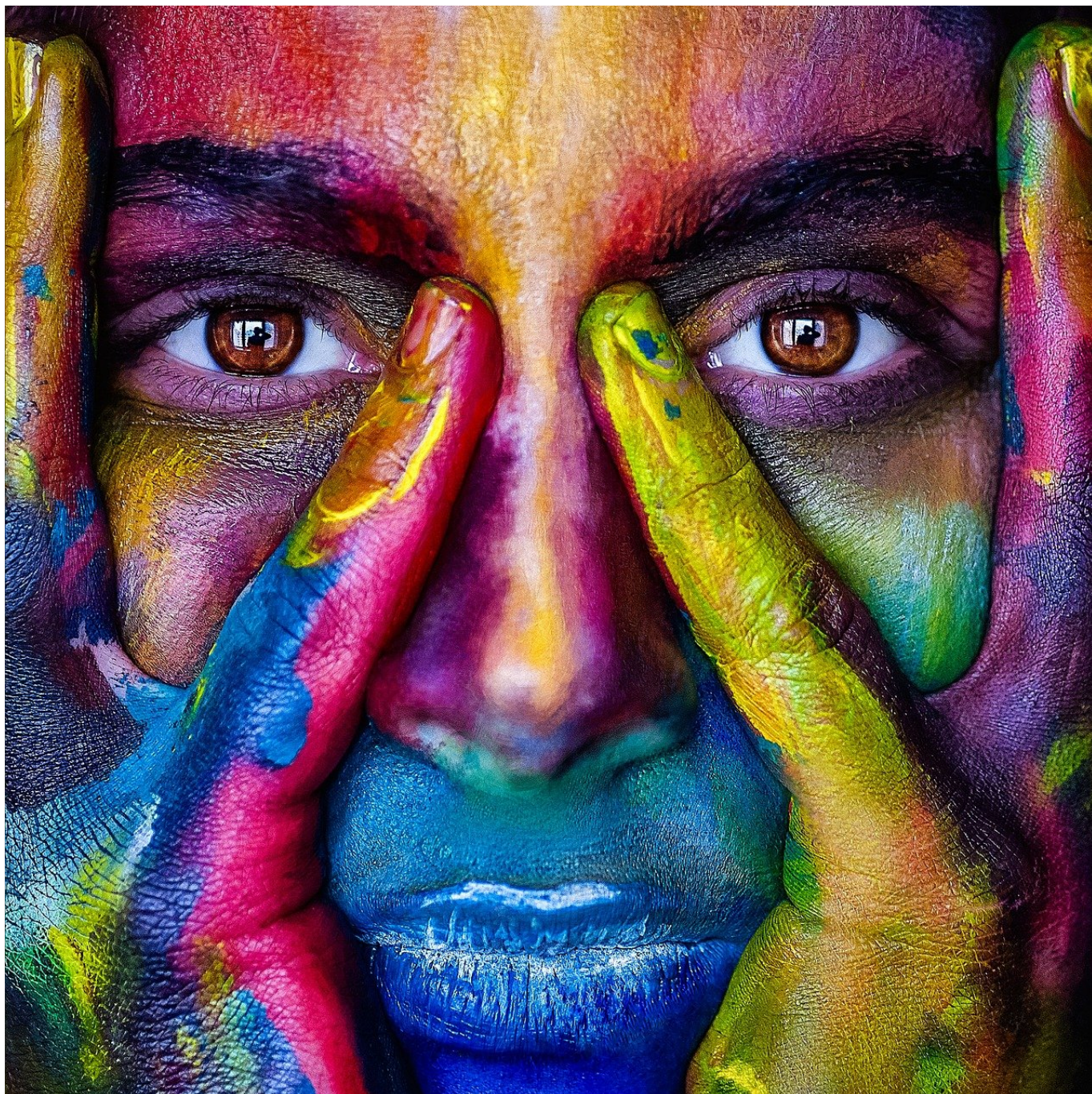
<u>adolescent</u>	An adolescent boy or girl. <i>The books are aimed at children and adolescents.</i>
attendant	A person employed to provide a service to the public in a particular place. <i>A mosaic of the Empress Theodora with her attendants.</i>
<u>daughter</u>	A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source. <i>As radon gas decays it produces daughters that attach themselves to dust particles.</i>
female child	A person who belongs to the sex that can have babies.
fille	A young woman.
<u>girlfriend</u>	A woman's female friend. <i>Mary and her girlfriend organized the party.</i>
lady friend	A woman of the peerage in Britain.
little girl	A small amount or duration.

<u>lover</u>	A partner in a sexual or romantic relationship outside marriage. <i>He was a great lover of cats.</i>
<u>miss</u>	A young woman. <i>The penalty miss cost us the game.</i>
missy	A young woman. <i>Don t tell lies missy he said sternly.</i>
<u>partner</u>	A person s partner in marriage. <i>Sexual partners.</i>
retainer	A servant, especially one who has worked for a person or family for a long time. <i>Faithful family retainers.</i>
<u>sweetheart</u>	A very attractive or seductive looking woman. <i>Don t worry sweetheart I ve got it all worked out.</i>
<u>teenager</u>	A juvenile between the onset of puberty and maturity.
woman	A disrespectful form of address to a woman. <i>He wondered whether Billy had his woman with him.</i>
young lady	United States film and television actress (1913-2000).
young person	United States jazz tenor saxophonist (1909-1959).
young woman	Any immature animal.
youngster	A young person of either sex. <i>Tiddler is a British term for youngster.</i>

adolescent

Relating to or peculiar to or suggestive of an adolescent.
Adolescent boys and girls.

<u>bachelor</u>	Lead a bachelor's existence. <i>One of the country's most eligible bachelors.</i>
<u>daughter</u>	A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source. <i>A daughter of the dry savannas of Africa.</i>
female	Relating to women or the female gender. <i>Both males and females accumulate economic knowledge at a similar rate.</i>
feminine	A feminine word or form. <i>A feminine voice.</i>
<u>feminist</u>	A supporter of feminism. <i>Feminist literature.</i>
<u>guy</u>	Steady or support with a guy wire or cable. <i>A nice guy.</i>
infantile	Being or befitting or characteristic of an infant. <i>Infantile games.</i>
ingenue	An artless innocent young girl (especially as portrayed on the stage).
<u>juvenile</u>	An actor playing a juvenile role. <i>Their behavior was juvenile.</i>
kid	A human offspring (son or daughter) of any age. <i>After we relaxed we just kidded around.</i>
lass	A girl or young woman who is unmarried. <i>He married a lass from Yorkshire.</i>
maiden	Being or involving the first attempt or act of its kind. <i>The liner's maiden voyage.</i>
maidenhood	The childhood of a girl. <i>Most brides wear white to symbolize maidenhood.</i>
matriarchy	A system of society or government ruled by a woman or women. <i>A matriarchy run by morally superior women.</i>
maturation	(medicine) the formation of morbid matter in an abscess or a vesicle and the discharge of pus. <i>White wines generally need less maturation than reds.</i>
philander	Have amorous affairs; of men. <i>Married men who philander.</i>
plaything	An artifact designed to be played with. <i>The rocking horse has been a favourite child's plaything for generations.</i>
puberty	The period during which adolescents reach sexual maturity and become capable of reproduction. <i>The onset of puberty.</i>

stripling	A young man. <i>He s a mere stripling.</i>
teen	A teenager. <i>The teen years.</i>
tomboy	A girl who enjoys rough, noisy activities traditionally associated with boys.
widow	A widowbird. <i>He was recently widowed.</i>
widower	A man whose wife is dead especially one who has not remarried. <i>Her new found passion has turned me into a tennis widower.</i>
woman	A disrespectful form of address to a woman. <i>He wondered whether Billy had his woman with him.</i>
young	Relating to or consisting of young people. <i>Many grebes carry their young on their backs.</i>
youngster	A young person of either sex. <i>Tiddler is a British term for youngster.</i>
youth	The period between childhood and adult age. <i>Youth everywhere rises in revolt.</i>
