## **Girlfriend as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Girlfriend" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “girlfriend” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Any female friend.*
- *A woman's female friend.*
- *A person's regular female companion with whom they have a romantic or sexual relationship.*
- *A girl or young woman with whom a man is romantically involved.*



## Synonyms of "Girlfriend" as a noun (5 Words)

### girl

A girl or young woman with whom a man is romantically involved.  
*A six year old **girl**.*

**lady friend** A woman of the peerage in Britain.

### lover

A person who likes or enjoys a specified thing.  
*He was a great **lover** of cats.*

### partner

A person's partner in marriage.  
*A junior **partner**.*

### **woman**

A disrespectful form of address to a woman.  
*He wondered whether Billy had his **woman** with him.*



## Usage Examples of "Girlfriend" as a noun

- *His girlfriend kicked him out.*
- *Mary and her girlfriend organized the party.*
- *He lives with his girlfriend.*
- *She would rather go to the cinema with a girlfriend.*





## Associations of "Girlfriend" (30 Words)

<b>beau</b>	A man who is much concerned with his dress and appearance.
<b>betroth</b>	Give to in marriage. <i>In no time I shall be <b>betrothed</b> to Isabel.</i>
<b>boyfriend</b>	A man who is the lover of a man or woman. <i>A <b>boyfriend</b> cardigan.</i>
<b>buff</b>	A soft thick undyed leather from the skins of e g buffalo or oxen. <i>The driver was a <b>buff</b> blond named March.</i>
<b>concubine</b>	(in polygamous societies) a woman who lives with a man but has lower status than his wife or wives.
<b>couple</b>	A pair who associate with one another. <i>Resistors are used to <b>couple</b> the oscillators.</i>
<b>devotee</b>	A strong believer in a particular religion or god. <i><b>Devotees</b> of Krishna.</i>
<b>ex</b>	A man who was formerly a certain woman's husband. <i>All his <b>exes</b> live in Texas.</i>
<b>fan</b>	A fan shaped alluvial or talus deposit at the foot of a slope. <i>He <b>fanned</b> himself with his hat.</i>
<b>fiance</b>	A man who is engaged to be married.
<b>fiancee</b>	A woman who is engaged to be married.
<b>girl</b>	A girl or young woman with whom a man is romantically involved. <i>The baby was a <b>girl</b>.</i>
<b>guy</b>	Steady or support with a guy wire or cable. <i>The Italians <b>guyed</b> the Tower of Pisa to prevent it from collapsing.</i>
<b>husband</b>	A married man; a woman's partner in marriage. <i>She and her <b>husband</b> are both retired.</i>
<b>idolater</b>	A person who worships idols.
<b>idolatry</b>	Extreme admiration, love, or reverence for something or someone. <i>We must not allow our <b>idolatry</b> of art to obscure issues of political significance.</i>
<b>lass</b>	A girl or young woman. <i>He married a <b>lass</b> from Yorkshire.</i>
<b>lover</b>	A person who likes or enjoys a specified thing. <i>I think she had a secret <b>lover</b>.</i>

<b>maidenhood</b>	The fact or condition of being a young, unmarried woman. <i>Most brides wear white to symbolize <b>maidenhood</b>.</i>
<b>mistress</b>	A woman loved and courted by a man. <i>A Geography <b>mistress</b>.</i>
<b>moll</b>	A gangster's female companion. <i>I'd rush the money over to his <b>moll</b>.</i>
<b>outmoded</b>	Old-fashioned. <i>An <b>outmoded</b> Victorian building.</i>
<u><b>paramour</b></u>	A woman's lover.
<u><b>pretty</b></u>	Make pretty or attractive. <i>A <b>pretty</b> little girl with an engaging grin.</i>
<b>troth</b>	A mutual promise to marry. <i>A token of <b>troth</b>.</i>
<b>votary</b>	A priest or priestess (or consecrated worshipper) in a non-Christian religion or cult. <i>He was a <b>votary</b> of John Keats.</i>
<b>wed</b>	Perform a marriage ceremony. <i>They <b>wed</b> a week after meeting.</i>
<b>widower</b>	A man whose wife is dead especially one who has not remarried. <i>Her new found passion has turned me into a tennis <b>widower</b>.</i>
<u><b>wife</b></u>	The wife of a person with a specified occupation. <i>A clergy <b>wife</b>.</i>
