afford	Afford access to. <i>The rooftop terrace affords beautiful views.</i>
allocate	Distribute according to a plan or set apart for a special purpose. <i>Students are allocated accommodation on a yearly basis.</i>
allot	Give or apportion (something) to someone. <i>Equal time was allotted to each.</i>
amortization	The reduction of the value of an asset by prorating its cost over a period of years. <i>75 of the mortgages have an amortization of 25 years or less.</i>
apportion	Give out as one's portion or share. <i>Voting power will be apportioned according to contribution.</i>
assign	Give an assignment to a person to a post or assign a task to a person. <i>She has been assigned to a new job.</i>
authorization	The action of authorizing. <i>Deputies are given authorization to make arrests.</i>
bestow	Bestow a quality on. <i>Stooping to bestow the presents into eager hands.</i>
capitulate	Cease to resist an opponent or an unwelcome demand; yield. <i>The patriots had to capitulate to the enemy forces.</i>
cede	Relinquish possession or control over. <i>In 1874 the islands were ceded to Britain.</i>
certificate	Present someone with a certificate. <i>A university accredited certificate.</i>
compensate	Make payment to compensate. <i>She was compensated for the loss of her arm in the accident.</i>
compensation	The action or process of awarding compensation. <i>A compensation claim.</i>

concession	The act of conceding or yielding. <i>New logging concessions.</i>
copyright	A particular literary artistic or musical work that is covered by copyright. <i>Works whose copyrights had lapsed.</i>
credential	Provide with credentials. <i>His campaign has refused to credential any reporter from that outlet.</i>
distribute	Cause to be distributed. <i>The journal is distributed worldwide.</i>
endow	Furnish with an endowment. <i>He was endowed with tremendous physical strength.</i>
fee	Give a tip or gratuity to in return for a service, beyond the compensation agreed on. <i>They were faced with legal fees of 3000.</i>
forgo	Be earlier in time; go back further. <i>We forgo any comparison between the two men.</i>
generously	In a way that shows a readiness to give more of something, especially money, than is necessary or expected. <i>Food is shared generously.</i>
grant	The action of granting something. <i>Grant land.</i>
impart	Bestow (a quality). <i>Impart a new skill to the students.</i>
presentation	A visual representation of something. <i>The presentation of new data.</i>
provide	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. <i>Provide for the proper care of the passengers on the cruise ship.</i>
remuneration	Money paid for work or a service. <i>Adequate remuneration for his work.</i>
scholarship	Financial aid provided to a student on the basis of academic merit. <i>Tim held a Humboldt scholarship.</i>
submit	Yield to another's wish or opinion. <i>Samples submitted to low pressure while being airfreighted.</i>
wage	The part of total production that is the return to labour as earned income as distinct from the remuneration received by capital as unearned income. <i>Wages were paid by check.</i>
