## Associations of "Give in" (30 Words)

<b>afford</b>	Afford access to. <i>The rooftop terrace <b>affords</b> beautiful views.</i>
<b>allocate</b>	Distribute according to a plan or set apart for a special purpose. <i>Students are <b>allocated</b> accommodation on a yearly basis.</i>
<b>allot</b>	Give or apportion (something) to someone. <i>Equal time was <b>allotted</b> to each.</i>
<b>amortization</b>	The reduction of the value of an asset by prorating its cost over a period of years. <i>75 of the mortgages have an <b>amortization</b> of 25 years or less.</i>
<b>apportion</b>	Give out as one's portion or share. <i>Voting power will be <b>apportioned</b> according to contribution.</i>
<b>assign</b>	Give an assignment to a person to a post or assign a task to a person. <i>She has been <b>assigned</b> to a new job.</i>
<b>authorization</b>	The action of authorizing. <i>Deputies are given <b>authorization</b> to make arrests.</i>
<b>bestow</b>	Bestow a quality on. <i>Stooping to <b>bestow</b> the presents into eager hands.</i>
<b>capitulate</b>	Cease to resist an opponent or an unwelcome demand; yield. <i>The patriots had to <b>capitulate</b> to the enemy forces.</i>
<b>cede</b>	Relinquish possession or control over. <i>In 1874 the islands were <b>ceded</b> to Britain.</i>
<b>certificate</b>	Present someone with a certificate. <i>A university accredited <b>certificate</b>.</i>
<b>compensate</b>	Make payment to compensate. <i>She was <b>compensated</b> for the loss of her arm in the accident.</i>
<b>compensation</b>	The action or process of awarding compensation. <i>A <b>compensation</b> claim.</i>

<b>concession</b>	The act of conceding or yielding. <i>New logging <b>concessions</b>.</i>
<b>copyright</b>	A particular literary artistic or musical work that is covered by copyright. <i>Works whose <b>copyrights</b> had lapsed.</i>
<b>credential</b>	Provide with credentials. <i>His campaign has refused to <b>credential</b> any reporter from that outlet.</i>
<b>distribute</b>	Cause to be distributed. <i>The journal is <b>distributed</b> worldwide.</i>
<b>endow</b>	Furnish with an endowment. <i>He was <b>endowed</b> with tremendous physical strength.</i>
<b>fee</b>	Give a tip or gratuity to in return for a service, beyond the compensation agreed on. <i>They were faced with legal <b>fees</b> of 3000.</i>
<b>forgo</b>	Be earlier in time; go back further. <i>We <b>forgo</b> any comparison between the two men.</i>
<b>generously</b>	In a way that shows a readiness to give more of something, especially money, than is necessary or expected. <i>Food is shared <b>generously</b>.</i>
<b>grant</b>	The action of granting something. <i><b>Grant</b> land.</i>
<b>impart</b>	Bestow (a quality). <i><b>Impart</b> a new skill to the students.</i>
<b>presentation</b>	A visual representation of something. <i>The <b>presentation</b> of new data.</i>
<b>provide</b>	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. <i><b>Provide</b> for the proper care of the passengers on the cruise ship.</i>
<b>remuneration</b>	Money paid for work or a service. <i>Adequate <b>remuneration</b> for his work.</i>
<b>scholarship</b>	Financial aid provided to a student on the basis of academic merit. <i>Tim held a Humboldt <b>scholarship</b>.</i>
<b>submit</b>	Yield to another's wish or opinion. <i>Samples <b>submitted</b> to low pressure while being airfreighted.</i>
<b>wage</b>	The part of total production that is the return to labour as earned income as distinct from the remuneration received by capital as unearned income. <i><b>Wages</b> were paid by check.</i>
