## Associations of "Give off" (30 Words)

<b>abjure</b>	Formally reject or disavow a formerly held belief, usually under pressure. <i>MPs were urged to <b>abjure</b> their Jacobite allegiance.</i>
<b>abrogation</b>	The repeal or abolition of a law, right, or agreement.
<b><a href="#">afford</a></b>	Afford access to. <i>It was taking up more time than he could <b>afford</b>.</i>
<b>allocate</b>	Distribute (resources or duties) for a particular purpose. <i>In past years we didn't <b>allocate</b> enough funds to infrastructure maintenance.</i>
<b>allot</b>	Give out. <i>I was <b>allotted</b> a little room in the servants block.</i>
<b>authorization</b>	The act of conferring legality or sanction or formal warrant. <i>Horowitz handed him the <b>authorization</b> signed by Evans.</i>
<b>bestow</b>	Bestow a quality on. <i><b>Bestow</b> an honor on someone.</i>
<b>bestowal</b>	The act of conferring an honor or presenting a gift.
<b><a href="#">cancel</a></b>	A notation cancelling a previous sharp or flat. <i>I intend to <b>cancel</b> your debt to me.</i>
<b>capitulate</b>	Surrender under agreed conditions. <i>The patriots had to <b>capitulate</b> to the enemy forces.</i>
<b>cede</b>	Give up (power or territory). <i>In 1874 the islands were <b>ceded</b> to Britain.</i>
<b>certificate</b>	Authorize by certificate. <i>A share <b>certificate</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">compensate</a></b>	Make payment to compensate. <i>He will be richly <b>compensated</b> for his efforts.</i>
<b>concession</b>	A piece of land into which surveyed land is divided. <i>Railcard holders can obtain <b>concessions</b>.</i>

<b><u>counterbalance</u></b>	A factor having the opposite effect to that of another and so preventing it from exercising a disproportionate influence. <i>The sitter s weight <b>counterbalances</b> the tilting pressure on the backrest.</i>
<b>credential</b>	Provide with credentials. <i>Recruitment is based mainly on academic <b>credentials</b>.</i>
<b>distribute</b>	Cause to be distributed. <i>The function <b>distributes</b> the values evenly.</i>
<b>endow</b>	Furnish with an endowment. <i>He was <b>endowed</b> with tremendous physical strength.</i>
<b>foreswear</b>	Do without or cease to hold or adhere to. <i>I am <b>foreswearing</b> women forever.</i>
<b><u>forgo</u></b>	Do without or cease to hold or adhere to. <i>We <b>forgo</b> any comparison between the two men.</i>
<b>grant</b>	The action of granting something. <i><b>Grant</b> permission.</i>
<b><u>impart</u></b>	Bestow a quality on. <i><b>Impart</b> a new skill to the students.</i>
<b><u>offset</u></b>	Create an offset in. <i>There was some <b>offsetting</b> on to text.</i>
<b>presentation</b>	A visual representation of something. <i>The <b>presentation</b> of new data.</i>
<b>relinquish</b>	Voluntarily cease to keep or claim; give up. <i><b>Relinquish</b> your grip on the rope you won t fall.</i>
<b><u>submit</u></b>	Accept or undergo, often unwillingly. <i>He <b>submitted</b> himself to a body search.</i>
<b><u>surrender</u></b>	The action of surrendering a lease or life insurance policy. <i>The final <b>surrender</b> of Germany on 8 May 1945.</i>
<b><u>waive</u></b>	Refrain from insisting on or using (a right or claim). <i>He will <b>waive</b> all rights to the money.</i>
<b>withdraw</b>	Withdraw from active participation. <i>He failed to <b>withdraw</b> his remarks and apologize.</i>
<b>yield</b>	Give in, as to influence or pressure. <i>The milk <b>yield</b> was poor.</i>
