bestowal The act of conferring an honor or presenting a gift.

A notation cancelling a previous sharp or flat.

Cancel I intend to cancel your debt to me.

Surrender under agreed conditions.

The patriots had to **capitulate** to the enemy forces.

Give up (power or territory.

cede
In 1874 the islands were **cede**d to Britain.

certificate Authorize by certificate.

A share certificate.

Make payment to compensate.

He will be richly **compensate**d for his efforts.

concession A piece of land into which surveyed land is divided.

Railcard holders can obtain **concession**s.



A factor having the opposite effect to that of another and so preventing it

<u>counterbalance</u> from exercising a disproportionate influence.

The sitter's weight **counterbalance**s the tilting pressure on the backrest.

Provide with credentials.

distribute Cause to be distributed.

The function **distribute**s the values evenly.

endow Furnish with an endowment.

He was **endow**ed with tremendous physical strength.

foreswear Do without or cease to hold or adhere to.

I am **foreswear**ing women forever.

forgo Do without or cease to hold or adhere to.

We **forgo** any comparison between the two men.

grant The action of granting something.

Grant permission.

impart Bestow a quality on.

Impart a new skill to the students.

offset Create an offset in.

There was some **offset**ting on to text.

Presentation A visual representation of something.

The **presentation** of new data.

relinquish

Voluntarily cease to keep or claim; give up.

Relinquish your grip on the rope you won t fall.

submit Accept or undergo, often unwillingly.

He **submit**ted himself to a body search.

The action of surrendering a lease or life insurance policy.

The final **surrender** of Germany on 8 May 1945.

Refrain from insisting on or using (a right or claim.

He will **waive** all rights to the money.

withdraw Withdraw from active participation.

He failed to **withdraw** his remarks and apologize.

yield Give in, as to influence or pressure.

The milk **yield** was poor.
