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Associations of "Give off" (30 Words)

abjure	Formally reject or disavow a formerly held belief, usually under pressure. <i>MPs were urged to abjure their Jacobite allegiance.</i>
abrogation	The repeal or abolition of a law, right, or agreement.
afford	Afford access to. <i>It was taking up more time than he could afford.</i>
allocate	Distribute (resources or duties) for a particular purpose. <i>In past years we didn't allocate enough funds to infrastructure maintenance.</i>
allot	Give out. <i>I was allotted a little room in the servants block.</i>
authorization	The act of conferring legality or sanction or formal warrant. <i>Horowitz handed him the authorization signed by Evans.</i>
bestow	Bestow a quality on. <i>Bestow an honor on someone.</i>
bestowal	The act of conferring an honor or presenting a gift.
cancel	A notation cancelling a previous sharp or flat. <i>I intend to cancel your debt to me.</i>
capitulate	Surrender under agreed conditions. <i>The patriots had to capitulate to the enemy forces.</i>
cede	Give up (power or territory). <i>In 1874 the islands were ceded to Britain.</i>
certificate	Authorize by certificate. <i>A share certificate.</i>
compensate	Make payment to compensate. <i>He will be richly compensated for his efforts.</i>
concession	A piece of land into which surveyed land is divided. <i>Railcard holders can obtain concessions.</i>

counterbalance	A factor having the opposite effect to that of another and so preventing it from exercising a disproportionate influence. <i>The sitter s weight counterbalances the tilting pressure on the backrest.</i>
credential	Provide with credentials. <i>Recruitment is based mainly on academic credentials.</i>
distribute	Cause to be distributed. <i>The function distributes the values evenly.</i>
endow	Furnish with an endowment. <i>He was endowed with tremendous physical strength.</i>
foreswear	Do without or cease to hold or adhere to. <i>I am foreswearing women forever.</i>
forgo	Do without or cease to hold or adhere to. <i>We forgo any comparison between the two men.</i>
grant	The action of granting something. <i>Grant permission.</i>
impart	Bestow a quality on. <i>Impart a new skill to the students.</i>
offset	Create an offset in. <i>There was some offsetting on to text.</i>
presentation	A visual representation of something. <i>The presentation of new data.</i>
relinquish	Voluntarily cease to keep or claim; give up. <i>Relinquish your grip on the rope you won t fall.</i>
submit	Accept or undergo, often unwillingly. <i>He submitted himself to a body search.</i>
surrender	The action of surrendering a lease or life insurance policy. <i>The final surrender of Germany on 8 May 1945.</i>
waive	Refrain from insisting on or using (a right or claim). <i>He will waive all rights to the money.</i>
withdraw	Withdraw from active participation. <i>He failed to withdraw his remarks and apologize.</i>
yield	Give in, as to influence or pressure. <i>The milk yield was poor.</i>
