## Associations of "Give out" (30 Words)

<b>allocate</b>	Distribute (resources or duties) for a particular purpose. <i>In past years we didn't <b>allocate</b> enough funds to infrastructure maintenance.</i>
<b>allot</b>	Administer or bestow, as in small portions. <i>Equal time was <b>allotted</b> to each.</i>
<b>amortization</b>	The reduction of the value of an asset by prorating its cost over a period of years. <i>An <b>amortization</b> schedule shows your payments each month and how it affects the total amount you owe.</i>
<a href="#">apportion</a>	Give out as one's portion or share. <i>Voting power will be <b>apportioned</b> according to contribution.</i>
<b>appropriation</b>	Money set aside (as by a legislature) for a specific purpose. <i>Dishonest <b>appropriation</b> of property.</i>
<b>assign</b>	Give an assignment to a person to a post or assign a task to a person. <i>His leader <b>assigned</b> him this mission.</i>
<b>authorization</b>	Official permission or approval. <i>Deputies are given <b>authorization</b> to make arrests.</i>
<b>bestow</b>	Bestow a quality on. <i>Stooping to <b>bestow</b> the presents into eager hands.</i>
<b>bestowal</b>	A gift that is bestowed or conferred.
<b>capitulate</b>	Cease to resist an opponent or an unwelcome demand; yield. <i>The patriots had to <b>capitulate</b> to the enemy forces.</i>
<b>cede</b>	Give over; surrender or relinquish to the physical control of another. <i>In 1874 the islands were <b>ceded</b> to Britain.</i>
<b>certificate</b>	Authorize by certificate. <i>An 18 <b>certificate</b>.</i>

<b>concession</b>	The action of conceding or granting something. <i>Tax <b>concessions</b>.</i>
<b>contribution</b>	A piece of writing submitted for publication in a journal, book, etc. <i>Local historians are requesting <b>contributions</b> for a forthcoming book on the history of the community.</i>
<b>credential</b>	Provide with credentials. <i>The Russian ambassador presented his <b>credentials</b> on September 30.</i>
<b>dispense</b>	(of a machine or container) supply or release (a product or cash). <i>The machine <b>dispenses</b> soft drinks.</i>
<b>distribute</b>	Cause to be distributed. <i>The seat is designed to ensure the weight of the passenger is evenly <b>distributed</b>.</i>
<b>donee</b>	The recipient of funds or other benefits.
<b>endow</b>	Furnish with an endowment. <i>I had two brothers who were both better <b>endowed</b> than me.</i>
<b>forgo</b>	Lose (s.th.) or lose the right to (s.th.) by some error, offense, or crime. <i>She wanted to <b>forgo</b> the tea and leave while they could.</i>
<b>grant</b>	The action of granting something. <i><b>Grant</b> a degree.</i>
<b>handout</b>	Giving money or food or clothing to a needy person. <i>Dependence on central government <b>handouts</b>.</i>
<b>impart</b>	Bestow a quality on. <i>The teachers <b>imparted</b> a great deal of knowledge to their pupils.</i>
<b>presentation</b>	A visual representation of something. <i>Cesarean sections are sometimes the result of abnormal <b>presentations</b>.</i>
<b>prioritize</b>	Determine the order for dealing with (a series of items or tasks) according to their relative importance. <i>We have too many things to do and must <b>prioritize</b>.</i>
<b>salary</b>	Pay a salary to. <i>He received a <b>salary</b> of 24 000.</i>
<b>scholarship</b>	Profound scholarly knowledge. <i>Tim held a Humboldt <b>scholarship</b>.</i>
<b>share</b>	Give out as one's portion or share. <i>She had never <b>shared</b> the secret with anyone before.</i>
<b>submit</b>	(especially in judicial contexts) suggest; argue. <i>He <b>submitted</b> himself to a body search.</i>
