Associations of "Give out" (30 Words)

allocate	Distribute (resources or duties) for a particular purpose. <i>In past years we didn't allocate enough funds to infrastructure maintenance.</i>
allot	Administer or bestow, as in small portions. <i>Equal time was allotted to each.</i>
amortization	The reduction of the value of an asset by prorating its cost over a period of years. <i>An amortization schedule shows your payments each month and how it affects the total amount you owe.</i>
apportion	Give out as one's portion or share. <i>Voting power will be apportioned according to contribution.</i>
appropriation	Money set aside (as by a legislature) for a specific purpose. <i>Dishonest appropriation of property.</i>
assign	Give an assignment to a person to a post or assign a task to a person. <i>His leader assigned him this mission.</i>
authorization	Official permission or approval. <i>Deputies are given authorization to make arrests.</i>
bestow	Bestow a quality on. <i>Stooping to bestow the presents into eager hands.</i>
bestowal	A gift that is bestowed or conferred.
capitulate	Cease to resist an opponent or an unwelcome demand; yield. <i>The patriots had to capitulate to the enemy forces.</i>
cede	Give over; surrender or relinquish to the physical control of another. <i>In 1874 the islands were ceded to Britain.</i>
certificate	Authorize by certificate. <i>An 18 certificate.</i>

concession	The action of conceding or granting something. <i>Tax concessions.</i>
contribution	A piece of writing submitted for publication in a journal, book, etc. <i>Local historians are requesting contributions for a forthcoming book on the history of the community.</i>
credential	Provide with credentials. <i>The Russian ambassador presented his credentials on September 30.</i>
dispense	(of a machine or container) supply or release (a product or cash). <i>The machine dispenses soft drinks.</i>
distribute	Cause to be distributed. <i>The seat is designed to ensure the weight of the passenger is evenly distributed.</i>
donee	The recipient of funds or other benefits.
endow	Furnish with an endowment. <i>I had two brothers who were both better endowed than me.</i>
forgo	Lose (s.th.) or lose the right to (s.th.) by some error, offense, or crime. <i>She wanted to forgo the tea and leave while they could.</i>
grant	The action of granting something. <i>Grant a degree.</i>
handout	Giving money or food or clothing to a needy person. <i>Dependence on central government handouts.</i>
impart	Bestow a quality on. <i>The teachers imparted a great deal of knowledge to their pupils.</i>
presentation	A visual representation of something. <i>Cesarean sections are sometimes the result of abnormal presentations.</i>
prioritize	Determine the order for dealing with (a series of items or tasks) according to their relative importance. <i>We have too many things to do and must prioritize.</i>
salary	Pay a salary to. <i>He received a salary of 24 000.</i>
scholarship	Profound scholarly knowledge. <i>Tim held a Humboldt scholarship.</i>
share	Give out as one's portion or share. <i>She had never shared the secret with anyone before.</i>
submit	(especially in judicial contexts) suggest; argue. <i>He submitted himself to a body search.</i>
