## Associations of "Gives off" (30 Words)

<b>abjure</b>	Formally reject or disavow a formerly held belief, usually under pressure. <i>MPs were urged to <b>abjure</b> their Jacobite allegiance.</i>
<b>abrogation</b>	The act of abrogating; an official or legal cancellation.
<b>afford</b>	Afford access to. <i>I can t <b>afford</b> to spend two hours with this person.</i>
<b>allocate</b>	Distribute (resources or duties) for a particular purpose. <i>In past years we didn t <b>allocate</b> enough funds to infrastructure maintenance.</i>
<b>allot</b>	Allow to have. <i>Equal time was <b>allotted</b> to each.</i>
<b>authorization</b>	A document giving official permission. <i>Deputies are given <b>authorization</b> to make arrests.</i>
<b>bestow</b>	Bestow a quality on. <i><b>Bestow</b> an honor on someone.</i>
<b>bestowal</b>	A gift that is bestowed or conferred.
<b>cancel</b>	A notation cancelling a previous sharp or flat. <i><b>Cancel</b> the dinner party.</i>
<b>capitulate</b>	Surrender under agreed conditions. <i>The patriots had to <b>capitulate</b> to the enemy forces.</i>
<b>cede</b>	Give up (power or territory). <i>In 1874 the islands were <b>ceded</b> to Britain.</i>
<b>certificate</b>	Authorize by certificate. <i>A birth <b>certificate</b>.</i>
<b>compensate</b>	Make payment to compensate. <i>He will be richly <b>compensated</b> for his efforts.</i>
<b>concession</b>	A point conceded or yielded. <i>This strict rule was relaxed by <b>concession</b>.</i>

	Neutralize or cancel by exerting an opposite influence.
<b>counterbalance</b>	<i>The trolley used a <b>counterbalance</b> and leverage action to reduce the effort of lifting loads.</i>
<b>credential</b>	Provide with credentials. <i>His campaign has refused to <b>credential</b> any reporter from that outlet.</i>
<b>distribute</b>	Cause to be distributed. <i>The middle term must be <b>distributed</b> at least once in the premises.</i>
<b>endow</b>	Furnish with an endowment. <i>The country is well <b>endowed</b> with mineral resources.</i>
<b>foreswear</b>	Turn away from; give up. <i>I am <b>foreswearing</b> women forever.</i>
<b>forgo</b>	Be earlier in time; go back further. <i>She wanted to <b>forgo</b> the tea and leave while they could.</i>
<b>grant</b>	A right or privilege that has been granted. <i><b>Grant</b> a degree.</i>
<b>impart</b>	Make (information) known. <i>Shiitake mushrooms <b>impart</b> a wonderfully woody flavour to the salad.</i>
<b>offset</b>	Create an offset in. <i><b>Offset</b> adjustment circuits.</i>
<b>presentation</b>	A visual representation of something. <i>The <b>presentation</b> of certificates to new members.</i>
<b>relinquish</b>	Turn away from; give up. <i><b>Relinquish</b> your grip on the rope you won't fall.</i>
<b>submit</b>	Make an application as for a job or funding. <i>The original settlers were forced to <b>submit</b> to Bulgarian rule.</i>
<b>surrender</b>	The action of surrendering a lease or life insurance policy. <i>The last Taleban fighters finally <b>surrendered</b>.</i>
<b>waive</b>	Refrain from insisting on or using (a right or claim). <i>He will <b>waive</b> all rights to the money.</i>
<b>withdraw</b>	Withdraw from active participation. <i>It put me off taking the Pill my partner now <b>withdraws</b>.</i>
<b>yield</b>	Concede (a point of dispute). <i>He reeled into the house as the door <b>yielded</b>.</i>
