| afford | Afford access to. <i>It was taking up more time than he could afford.</i> |
| allocate | Distribute according to a plan or set apart for a special purpose. <i>Students are allocated accommodation on a yearly basis.</i> |
| allot | Give out. <i>I was allotted a little room in the servants block.</i> |
| amortization | A period in which a debt is reduced or paid off by regular payments. <i>75 of the mortgages have an amortization of 25 years or less.</i> |
| apportion | Give out as one’s portion or share. <i>They did not apportion blame or liability to any one individual.</i> |
| assign | Give an assignment to a person to a post or assign a task to a person. <i>Congress had assigned the task to the agency.</i> |
| authorization | The action of authorizing. <i>Deputies are given authorization to make arrests.</i> |
| bestow | Bestow a quality on. <i>The office was bestowed on him by the monarch of this realm.</i> |
| capitulate | Cease to resist an opponent or an unwelcome demand; yield. <i>The patriots had to capitulate to the enemy forces.</i> |
| cede | Give over; surrender or relinquish to the physical control of another. <i>In 1874 the islands were ceded to Britain.</i> |
| certificate | Authorize by certificate. <i>A birth certificate.</i> |
| compensate | Make payment to compensate. <i>He will be richly compensated for his efforts.</i> |
| compensation | The action or process of awarding compensation. <i>He is seeking compensation for injuries suffered at work.</i> |

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| concession | A point conceded or yielded. <i>They won all the concessions they asked for.</i> |
| copyright | A particular literary artistic or musical work that is covered by copyright. <i>He issued a writ for breach of copyright.</i> |
| credential | Provide with credentials. <i>Recruitment is based mainly on academic credentials.</i> |
| distribute | Be distributed or spread as in statistical analyses. <i>The publisher wants to distribute the book in Asia.</i> |
| endow | Furnish with an endowment. <i>He endowed three chairs at Liverpool University.</i> |
| fee | An interest in land capable of being inherited. <i>They were faced with legal fees of 3000.</i> |
| forgo | Be earlier in time; go back further. <i>We forgo any comparison between the two men.</i> |
| generously | In a way that shows kindness or warmth towards others. <i>Generously proportioned rooms.</i> |
| grant | The action of granting something. <i>They were granted a meeting.</i> |
| impart | Transmit (knowledge or skills). <i>Impart a new skill to the students.</i> |
| presentation | A visual representation of something. <i>A breach presentation.</i> |
| provide | Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. <i>Neither will provide answers to these problems.</i> |
| remuneration | The act of paying for goods or services or to recompense for losses. <i>They work in excess of their contracted hours for no additional remuneration.</i> |
| scholarship | A grant or payment made to support a student's education, awarded on the basis of academic or other achievement. <i>He went on a state sponsored scholarship to study engineering.</i> |
| submit | Consent to undergo a certain treatment. <i>The lawyers submitted the material to the court.</i> |
| wage | Carry on (wars, battles, or campaigns). <i>We were struggling to get better wages.</i> |
| yield | Be fatally overwhelmed. <i>They are forced to yield ground.</i> |
