## Associations of "Giving in" (30 Words)

<b>afford</b>	Afford access to. <i>It was taking up more time than he could <b>afford</b>.</i>
<b>allocate</b>	Distribute according to a plan or set apart for a special purpose. <i>Students are <b>allocated</b> accommodation on a yearly basis.</i>
<b>allot</b>	Give out. <i>I was <b>allotted</b> a little room in the servants block.</i>
<b>amortization</b>	A period in which a debt is reduced or paid off by regular payments. <i>75 of the mortgages have an <b>amortization</b> of 25 years or less.</i>
<b>apportion</b>	Give out as one’s portion or share. <i>They did not <b>apportion</b> blame or liability to any one individual.</i>
<b>assign</b>	Give an assignment to a person to a post or assign a task to a person. <i>Congress had <b>assigned</b> the task to the agency.</i>
<b>authorization</b>	The action of authorizing. <i>Deputies are given <b>authorization</b> to make arrests.</i>
<b>bestow</b>	Bestow a quality on. <i>The office was <b>bestowed</b> on him by the monarch of this realm.</i>
<b>capitulate</b>	Cease to resist an opponent or an unwelcome demand; yield. <i>The patriots had to <b>capitulate</b> to the enemy forces.</i>
<b>cede</b>	Give over; surrender or relinquish to the physical control of another. <i>In 1874 the islands were <b>ceded</b> to Britain.</i>
<b>certificate</b>	Authorize by certificate. <i>A birth <b>certificate</b>.</i>
<b>compensate</b>	Make payment to compensate. <i>He will be richly <b>compensated</b> for his efforts.</i>
<b>compensation</b>	The action or process of awarding compensation. <i>He is seeking <b>compensation</b> for injuries suffered at work.</i>

<b>concession</b>	A point conceded or yielded. <i>They won all the <b>concessions</b> they asked for.</i>
<b>copyright</b>	A particular literary artistic or musical work that is covered by copyright. <i>He issued a writ for breach of <b>copyright</b>.</i>
<b>credential</b>	Provide with credentials. <i>Recruitment is based mainly on academic <b>credentials</b>.</i>
<b>distribute</b>	Be distributed or spread as in statistical analyses. <i>The publisher wants to <b>distribute</b> the book in Asia.</i>
<b>endow</b>	Furnish with an endowment. <i>He <b>endowed</b> three chairs at Liverpool University.</i>
<b>fee</b>	An interest in land capable of being inherited. <i>They were faced with legal <b>fees</b> of 3000.</i>
<b>forgo</b>	Be earlier in time; go back further. <i>We <b>forgo</b> any comparison between the two men.</i>
<b>generously</b>	In a way that shows kindness or warmth towards others. <i><b>Generously</b> proportioned rooms.</i>
<b>grant</b>	The action of granting something. <i>They were <b>granted</b> a meeting.</i>
<b>impart</b>	Transmit (knowledge or skills). <i><b>Impart</b> a new skill to the students.</i>
<b>presentation</b>	A visual representation of something. <i>A breach <b>presentation</b>.</i>
<b>provide</b>	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. <i>Neither will <b>provide</b> answers to these problems.</i>
<b>remuneration</b>	The act of paying for goods or services or to recompense for losses. <i>They work in excess of their contracted hours for no additional <b>remuneration</b>.</i>
<b>scholarship</b>	A grant or payment made to support a student's education, awarded on the basis of academic or other achievement. <i>He went on a state sponsored <b>scholarship</b> to study engineering.</i>
<b>submit</b>	Consent to undergo a certain treatment. <i>The lawyers <b>submitted</b> the material to the court.</i>
<b>wage</b>	Carry on (wars, battles, or campaigns). <i>We were struggling to get better <b>wages</b>.</i>
<b>yield</b>	Be fatally overwhelmed. <i>They are forced to <b>yield</b> ground.</i>
