(of a document) signed and dated. given She was not often **given** to anger.

Express greetings upon meeting someone. greet

Sam threw open the door and was **greet**ed by a cacophony of noise.

In a joyous manner. **happily**

Happily today s situation is very different.

At an angle to the horizontal or vertical position. inclined

Wasn t inclined to believe the excuse.

Likely but not certain to be or become true or real. likely

Speculation on the **likely** effect of opting out.

It is fortunate that.

luckily Luckily for me it s worked out.

(usually followed by `to') naturally disposed toward. minded

Conservation **minded** citizens.

Dutifully complying with the commands or instructions of those in authority. obedient

The **obedient** colonies are heavily taxed the refractory remain unburdened.



Submit to the authority of (someone) or comply with (a law.

partiality A predisposition to like something.
